2003 (ACT NO. 10 OF 2003)****MITIGATION OF LOSS SUFFERED BY LIQUOR LICENCEES: EXTENSION OF
VALIDITY OF REGISTERED LICENCES AND DEFERRAL OF FEES PAYABLE**

I, Mlungisi Gerald Mvoko, member of the Executive Council responsible for Economic Development, Environmental Affairs and Tourism in the Province of the Eastern Cape in concurrence with the Member of the Executive Council responsible for Finance in the Province of the Eastern Cape, acting in terms of section 69(1)(b) of the Eastern Cape Liquor Act, 2003 (Act No.10 of 2003) hereby publish a notice in respect of the Regulations.

In terms of Section 69(1)(b) I hereby extend the validity of a liquor licence, that was already registered or deemed to have been registered before 27 of March 2020, by a period of six months. The period of extension shall take effect on 1 January 2021 and terminate on 30 June 2021.

The period for payment of renewal fees in respect of a liquor licence is extended to 30 June 2021. The payment of penalty fees is hereby waived.

Failure to renew a licence by 30 June 2021 will result in the cancellation thereof.

Renewal of licences for the year 2022, are subject to the provisions of the Eastern Cape Liquor Act, 10 of 2003 read together with the Regulations. The renewal period for 2022 will be from 1 October 2021 to 31 December 2021.

This Notice is called the Mitigation of loss suffered by Liquor Licencees due to COVID-19 and comes into operation on the date of publication in the Provincial Gazette.

This notice will allow for relief suffered by licence holders due to the restrictions placed on the liquor industry as set out in the Regulations to the Disaster Management Act, 2002 as a response to the CoVID-19 outbreak.
