i. HEALTH

Background

Historically outputs were never measured in Public Sector department despite amounts of money spent on so-called services. The allocation of grants in this Region still follows previous expenditure patterns, equity and equality principles not yet implemented. 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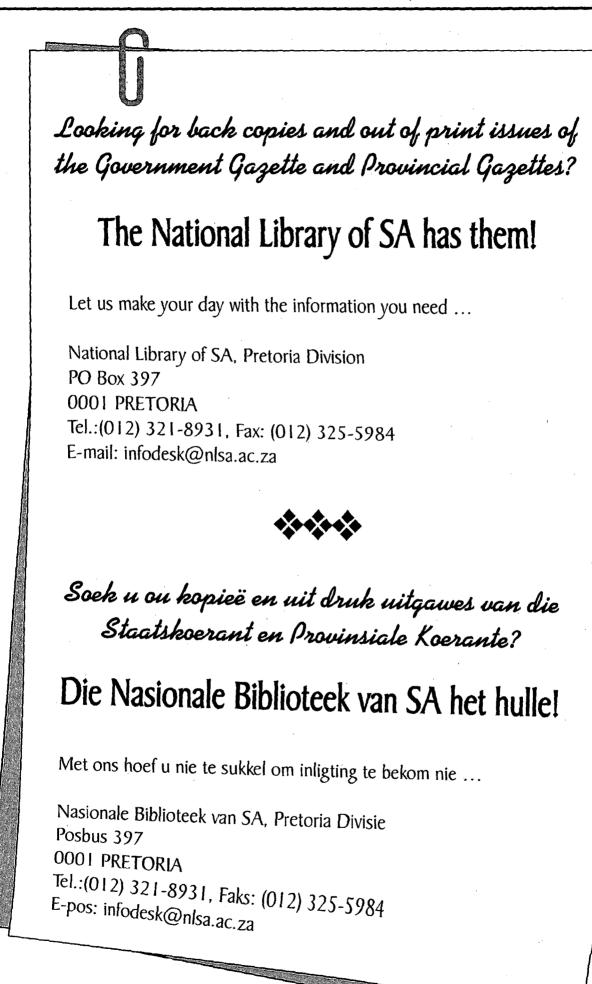
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
