

PROVINCIAL NOTICE 6

Notice of Intention to Close 49 public Pre-primary Schools in Gauteng

- 1. After a lengthy consultation process over a period of more than two years, with the various stakeholders in Early Childhood Development (ECD), including the Gauteng Education and Training Council, pre-primary school governing bodies and their associates, I undertook not to close the remaining 49 public Pre-primary Schools until the National Minister of Education amended national policy in line with the provincial policy.
- 2. The amendments to the national policy were gazetted on 13 December 2001 (No.22938).
- 3. The Gauteng Department of Education now intends to close all the schools listed below on 6 December 2002, the last day of the school year for 2002.
- 4. The reasons for my intention to close the schools are repeated once again:
 - 4.1 The existing public pre-primary model is not appropriate for all children in Gauteng and is not replicable for all.
 - 4.2 The public pre-primary schools in the province are located in historically advantaged suburbs and are therefore not accessible to all.
 - 4.3 The schools were inherited from the former Transvaal Education Department (TED) and originally served only white children. While the schools now enroll children of all races, they still serve a small minority of pre-school children in Gauteng. The vast majority of children have no access to ECD services at all.
 - 4.4 Gauteng at present has approximately 1 million children under the age of six, whereas public pre-primary schools in the province have never served more than approximately twelve thousand children at any given time.
 - 4.5 The provincial government cannot justify these provisioning imbalances within the ECD sector.
 - 4.6 The budgeted salary for the ECD sector in the province has annually stood at approximately R30 to R48 million, which could be used to reach out to more needy children in the form of subsidies to ECD services.

Based on these reasons, I have therefore resolved to close down the remaining public pre-primary schools, to open the way for an equitable system that will address the needs of all the children of the Gauteng province.

- 5. The Gauteng Department of Education has made every effort over the last two years to provide every ECD stakeholder with the opportunity to participate in the consultative process for the closure of public pre-primary schools.
- 6. Many stakeholders participated in this process and many written comments were received for consideration. Despite the exhaustive consultation process undertaken by the Gauteng Department of Education, I wish to extend one final opportunity to all stakeholders to make written representation to me regarding my intention to close the schools.

- 8. All written representations will be considered before a final decision to close the schools is made.
- 9. In the event that I do decide to close the schools, any governing body aggrieved by my decision to close a school may, within 30 days after receiving my notice of closure, appeal to the Executive Council, in writing, setting out the grounds of the appeal.
