

NOTICE 1020 OF 2012

<p>OPEN SEASON: ORDINARY GAME</p> <p>I, Nandi Mayathula-Khoza, Member of the Executive Council for Agriculture and Rural Development in the Province of Gauteng, acting under section 17(1)(a) of the Nature Conservation Ordinance (Ordinance 12 of 1983, as amended), hereby declare the periods mentioned in the first column of Schedule 1 to be an open season during which time the category of persons referred to in this Schedule may, subject to the provisions of the said Ordinance, hunt the species mentioned in the second column with daily bag limit of ordinary game mentioned in the third column in the area defined opposite it in the fourth column of this Schedule.</p>
