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

Notice submission deadlines

Government Printing Works has over the last few months implemented rules for completing and submitting the electronic Adobe Forms when you, the customer, submit your notice request.

In line with these business rules, GPW has revised the notice submission deadlines for all gazettes. Please refer to the GPW website www.gpwonline.co.za to familiarise yourself with the new deadlines.

CANCELLATIONS



Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette.

Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.

Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

AMENOMENTS TO NOTICES



With effect from 01 October, GPW will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

CUSTOMER INQUIRIES



Many of our customers request immediate feedback/confirmation of notice placement in the gazette from our Contact Centre once they have submitted their notice – While GPW deems it one of their highest priorities and responsibilities to provide customers with this requested feedback and the best service at all times, we are only able to do so once we have started processing your notice submission.

GPW has a **2-working day turnaround time for processing notices** received according to the business rules and deadline submissions.

Please keep this in mind when making inquiries about your notice submission at the Contact Centre.

PROOF OF PAYMENTS REMINDER

GPW reminds you that all notice submissions **MUST** be submitted with an accompanying proof of payment (PoP) or purchase order (PO). If any PoP's or PO's are received without a notice submission, it will be failed and your notice will not be processed.

When submitting your notice request to submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za, please ensure that a purchase order (GPW Account customer) or proof of payment (non-GPW Account customer) is included with your notice submission. All documentation relating to the notice submission must be in a single email.

A reminder that documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW. (In other words, your email should have an Adobe Form plus proof of payment/purchase order – 2 separate attachments – where notice content is applicable, it should also be a 3rd separate attachment).

REMINDER OF THE GPW BUSINESS RULES

- ☐ Single notice, single email with proof of payment or purchase order.
- All documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW.
- 1 notice = 1 form, i.e. each notice must be on a separate form
- ☐ Please submit your notice **ONLY ONCE.**

In terms of Section 103 of the Town-planning and Townships Ordinance, 1986 (Ordinance No 15 of 1986), the City of Tshwane hereby declares the township of Montana Extension 165 to be an approved township, subject to the conditions as set out in the Schedule hereto.

SCHEDULE

CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH THE APPLICATION MADE BY WEST DUNES PROPERTIES 142 (PTY) LTD, IN TERMS OF THE PROVISIONS OF CHAPTER III: PART C OF THE TOWN-PLANNING AND TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1986 (ORDINANCE NO 15 OF 1986), FOR PERMISSION TO ESTABLISH A TOWNSHIP ON PORTION 580 OF THE FARM HARTEBEEST-FONTEIN 324JR, PROVINCE OF GAUTENG, HAS BEEN GRANTED

CONDITIONS OF ESTABLISHMENT

1.1 NAME

The name of the township shall be Montana Extension 165.

1.2 DESIGN

The township shall consist of erven and streets as indicated on Plan CPD MNAX165/2.

1.3 DISPOSAL OF EXISTING CONDITIONS OF TITLE

All erven shall be made subject to existing conditions and servitudes, if any, including the reservation of the rights to minerals.

1.4 REMOVAL OR REPLACEMENT OF MUNICIPAL SERVICE

Should it become necessary to move or replace any existing municipal services as a result of the establishment of the township, the cost thereof shall be borne by the township owner.

1.5 DEMOLITION OF BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES

When required by the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality to do so, the township owner shall at his own expense cause to be demolished to the satisfaction of the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality all existing buildings and structures situated within building line reserves and side spaces or over common boundaries, or dilapidated structures.

1.6 REMOVAL OF LITTER

The township owner shall at his own expense have all litter within the township area removed to the satisfaction of the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality, when required to do so by the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality.

1.7 REMOVAL AND/OR REPLACEMENT OF ESKOM POWER LINES

Should it become necessary to remove and/or replace any existing power lines of Eskom as a result of the establishment of the township, the cost thereof shall be borne by the township owner.

1.8 REMOVAL AND/OR REPLACEMENT OF TELKOM SERVICES

Should it become necessary to remove and/or replace any existing TELKOM services as a result of the establishment of the township, the cost thereof shall be borne by the township owner.

1.9 COMPLIANCE WITH CONDITIONS IMPOSED BY GDARD

The township owner shall at his own expense comply with all the conditions imposed, by which the Gauteng Department of Agriculture and Rural Development including if applicable those by which exemption has been granted from compliance with regulations No 1182 and 1183 promulgated in terms of sections 21, 22 and 26 of the Environmental Conservation Act, (Act 73 of 1989) or the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act 107 of 1998) and Regulations thereto, as the case may be, for the development of this township.

1.10 CONSOLIDATION OF ERVEN

The township owner shall at his own expense have Erven 2132 and 2133 in the township consolidated. The City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality hereby grants its consent to the consolidation in respect of Section 92(2) (a) of Ordinance 15 of 1986.

2. CONDITIONS OF TITLE

2.1 THE ERVEN MENTIONED BELOW SHALL BE SUBJECT TO THE CONDITION AS INDICATED, LAID DOWN BY THE CITY OF TSHWANE METROPOLITAN MUNICIPALITY IN TERMS OF THE PROVISIONS OF THE TOWN-PLANNING AND TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1986 (ORDINANCE 15 OF 1986).

2.1.1 ERVEN 2132 AND 2133

- 2.1.1.1 The erf shall be subject to a servitude, 2m wide, for municipal services (water, sewer, electricity and storm water) (hereinafter referred to as "the services"), in favour of the City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality, along any two boundaries, excepting a street boundary and, in the case of a panhandle erf, an additional servitude for municipal purposes, 2 m wide, over the entrance portion of the erf, if and when required by the local authority: Provided that the local authority may waive any such servitude.
- 2.1.1.2 No buildings or other structures may be erected within the aforesaid servitude area and no trees with large roots may be planted within the area of such servitude or within a distance of 2 m from it.
- 2.1.1.3 The City of Tshwane Metropolitan Municipality shall be entitled to temporarily deposit on the land adjoining the aforesaid servitude, any material it excavates during the laying, maintenance or removal of such services and other works which in its discretion it regards necessary, and furthermore the Municipality shall be entitled to reasonable access to the said property for the aforesaid purpose, subject to the provision that the Municipality shall make good any damage caused during the laying, maintenance or removal of such services and other works.

2.1.2 ALL ERVEN

As this erf (stand, land, etc) forms part of an area which is subject to aircraft activity and noise as a result of the close proximity to the Wonderboom Airport, the owner thereof accepts that inconvenience with regard to noise as a result thereof, may be experienced.

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
