

CONDITIONS FOR PUBLICATION OF NOTICES

CLOSING TIMES FOR THE ACCEPTANCE OF NOTICES

- 1. (1) The KwaZulu-Natal Provincial Gazette is published every week on Thursday, and the closing time for the acceptance of notices which have to appear in the KwaZulu-Natal Provincial Gazette on any particular Thursday, is 15:00 one week prior to the publication date. Should any Thursday coincide with a public holiday, the publication date remains unchanged. However, the closing date for acceptance of advertisements moves backwards accordingly, in order to allow for 5 working days prior to the publication date.
 - (2) The date for the publication of an **Extraordinary** *KwaZulu-Natal Province Provincial Gazette* is negotiable.
- 2. (1) Notices received **after closing time** will be held over for publication in the next *KwaZulu-Natal Provincial Gazette*.
 - (2) Amendments or changes in notices cannot be undertaken unless instructions are received **before 10:00 on Fridays.**
 - (3) Notices for publication or amendments of original copy can not be accepted over the telephone and must be brought about by letter, by fax or by hand. The Government Printer will not be liable for any amendments done erroneously.
 - (4) In the case of cancellations a refund of the cost of a notice will be considered only if the instruction to cancel has been received on or before the stipulated closing time as indicated in paragraph 2(2).

APPROVAL OF NOTICES (This only applies to Private Companies)

3. AMENDMENT TO RATES BYLAWS

The KwaDukuza Municipality, acting under the authority of Section 156(2) of the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa Act 1996 (Act 108 of 1996) read with Section 11(3)(m) and Section 12 of the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act , 2000 (Act 32 of 2000) and Section 6 of the Local Government: Municipal Property Rates Act, 2004 (Act 6 of 2004), hereby publishes amendments to the Rates Bylaws of the KwaDukuza Municipality as set out hereunder:

Clause 10.2.7.1: amend to read as follows:

The Council shall only grant rates rebates to commercial and industrial properties in terms of existing service agreements. The rebates shall not be granted, or if granted be reversed, should the respective conditions of establishment not be met, or any section of the relevant Town Planning Scheme, Planning legislation, or National Building Regulations, be contravened.

Insert Clause 10.2.8.3 to read as follows:

The rebates shall not be granted, or if granted be reversed, should the respective conditions of establishment not be met, or any section of the relevant Town Planning Scheme, Planning legislation, or National Building Regulations, be contravened.

Insert Clause 10.5 to read as follows:

10.5 SPECIAL RATING AREAS

The municipality may by resolution of Council determine an area within the municipality as a special rating area and all parties must comply with the processes as set out in the Section 22 of the Act, as well as the policy governing special rating areas.

SHORT TITLE

The amendments to the rates bylaws shall be called Amendments to the Rates Bylaws of KwaDukuza Municipality.

COMMENCEMENT

The amendments to the Rates Bylaws of KwaDukuza Municipality come into force and effect on 1st July 2013.

BUDGET, ASSESSMENT RATES AND TARIFFS OF CHARGES 2013/2014

As required in terms of Section 16 and 24 of the Municipal Finance Management Act, Act No. 56 of 2003 and Section 14 of the Municipal Property Rates Act, Act No. 6 of 2004, Council has adopted the Budget for the 2013/14 financial year, together with the rates randages, Rates Policy and Tariffs of Charges, which are effective from 01 July 2013.

Notice is hereby given that a resolution has been taken by the Hibiscus Coast Municipality in terms of Section 75A of the Municipal Systems Act, Act No. 32 of 2000 and Section 14 of the Municipal Property Rates Act, 2004 (Act No. 6 of 2004). The general purport of the resolution is that the Budget has been approved, rates on immovable property within the jurisdiction of the Council have been assessed, Tariffs of Charges and Rates Policy approved and determined for the 2013/2014 municipal year as follows:

1. Rates have been assessed based on property values as contained in the general Valuation Roll. In addition to the first R15, 000.00 of the valuation for residential category of properties, which is impermissible in terms of the Municipal Property Rates Act, the Hibiscus Coast Municipality has included a further reduction of R85, 000.00 on improved properties and R50, 000.00 on vacant land in the calculations, as per the municipality's Rates Policy. The rate randages have been calculated for each rating category as follows:

- 2. In addition to the R100, 000.00 reduction on the valuation for improved residential category mentioned above, pensioners receive rebates on three levels, at 75%, 50% and 25% in terms of paragraph 11(2) of the municipality's Rates Policy read with Section 15(2) of the Municipal Property Rates Act, which will be displayed on the public notice boards at the various units and 100% for child headed households as per council adopted rates policy.
- Certain category 7 Institutions and category 8 special purpose properties do qualify for exemption in terms of paragraph 9 of the municipality's Rates Policy.
- 4. The final date for payment of 10 monthly instalments accounts of the general rates is the last working day of each month with the last instalment due on the last working day of May 2014. The final date of payment of the yearly general rates accounts is the last working day of September 2013. After the due dates interest of 9.5% per annum will be added, which is the bank lending rate at the date of this calculation plus 1% as per the Municipal Finance Management Act, 2003 (Act No. 56 of 2003) and the Municipal Property Rates Act regulations.
- 5. In its endeavour to restrain the outstanding debt from escalating and to encourage ratepayers to settle their accounts annually in full i.e. on or before 30 September 2013 the Municipality offers to those ratepayers 4% concession on the current 2013/2014 rates levied amount only(not on arrears or other services). Application forms are obtainable at the municipal offices in Port Shepstone (old Post Office building) or Lot 1000 Newton Place, Dan Pienaar Square, Margate or website www.hcm.gov.za

Council resolved to levy the rates on properties as detailed above in its meeting held on Tuesday, 28 May 2013, approving the Annual Budget, Rates Policy and Tariffs of Charges 2013/2014. A copy of the resolution is available for public inspection during office hours on the notice boards of the Council at the Hibberdene, Port Shepstone, Margate, Southbroom, Port Edward and Gamalakhe Civic Offices. It is also available on the municipality's website (www.hcm.gov.za).

This determination will come into operation on 1 July 2013.
