

CANCELLATIONS

Don't forget!

Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. **Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette.**

Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.

Your request for cancellation must be accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-).

AMENDMENTS TO NOTICES **take note!**

With effect from 01 October, GPW will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

Until then, amendments to notices must be received before the submission deadline.

CUSTOMER INQUIRIES



Many of our customers request immediate feedback/confirmation of notice placement in the gazette from our Contact Centre once they have submitted their notice – While GPW deems it one of their highest priorities and responsibilities to provide customers with this requested feedback and the best service at all times, we are only able to do so once we have started processing your notice submission.

PROOF OF PAYMENTS **REMINDER**

GPW reminds you that all notice submissions **MUST** be submitted with an accompanying proof of payment (PoP) or purchase order (PO). If any PoP's or PO's are received without a notice submission, it will be failed and your notice will not be processed.

When submitting your notice request to submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za, please ensure that a purchase order (GPW Account customer) or proof of payment (non-GPW Account customer) is included with your notice submission. All documentation relating to the notice submission must be in a single email.

A reminder that documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW. (In other words, your email should have an Adobe Form plus proof of payment/purchase order – 2 separate attachments – where notice content is applicable, it should also be a 3rd separate attachment).

CONDITIONS FOR PUBLICATION OF NOTICES

CLOSING TIMES FOR THE ACCEPTANCE OF NOTICES

1. (1) The *KwaZulu-Natal Province Provincial Gazette* is published every week on Thursday, and the closing time for the acceptance of notices which have to appear in the *KwaZulu-Natal Province Provincial Gazette* on any particular Thursday, is **15:00 one weeks prior to the publication date**. Should any Thursday coincide with a public holiday, the publication date remains unchanged. However, the closing date for acceptance of advertisements moves backwards accordingly, in order to allow for 7 working days prior to the publication date.
- (2) The date for the publication of a **Extraordinary** *KwaZulu-Natal Province Provincial Gazette* is negotiable.
2. (1) Copy of notices received **after closing time** will be held over for publication in the next *KwaZulu-Natal Province Provincial Gazette*.
- (2) Amendment or changes in copy of notices cannot be undertaken unless instructions are received **before 10:00 on Fridays**.
- (3) Copy of notices for publication or amendments of original copy can not be accepted over the telephone and must be brought about by letter, by fax or by hand. The Government Printer will not be liable for any amendments done erroneously.
- (4) In the case of cancellations a refund of the cost of a notice will be considered only if the instruction to cancel has been received on or before the stipulated closing time as indicated in paragraph 2 (2).

APPROVAL OF NOTICES (This only applies to Private Companies)

3. In the event where a cheque, submitted by an advertiser to the Government Printer as payment, is dishonoured, then the Government Printer reserves the right to refuse such client further access to the *KwaZulu-Natal Province Provincial Gazette* until all outstanding debts to the Government Printer is settled in full.

THE GOVERNMENT PRINTER INDEMNIFIED AGAINST LIABILITY

It can be arranged that money can be paid into the banking account of the Government Printer, in which case the deposit slip accompanies the advertisement before publication thereof.**

10. (1) The cost of a notice must be calculated by the advertiser in accordance with the word count table.

MUNICIPAL PROPERTY RATES BY-LAW(S)

NOTICE NO. 126/2015 DATED 9 SEPTEMBER 2015

PREAMBLE

WHEREAS Section 229 (1) of the Constitution requires a Municipality to impose rates on property and surcharges on fees for the services provided by or on behalf of the Municipality.

AND WHEREAS Section 13 of the Municipal Systems Act read with Section 162 of the Constitution require a Municipality to promulgate Municipal Bylaws by publishing them in the gazette of the relevant Province.

AND WHEREAS Section 6 of the Local Government: Municipal Property Rates Act, 2004 requires a Municipality to adopt Bylaws to give effect to the implementation of its Property Rates Policy; the Bylaws may differentiate between the different categories of properties and different categories of owners of properties liable for the payment of rates;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ENACTED by the Council of the Emnambithi/Ladysmith Municipality, as follows:

1. DEFINITIONS

In this Bylaw, any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Local Government: Municipal Property Rates Act, 2004 (Act No 6 of 2004), shall bear the same meaning unless the context indicates otherwise.

“Municipality” means Emnambithi/Ladysmith Municipality;

“Property Rates Act” means the Local Government: Municipal Property Rates Act, 2004 (Act No 6 of 2004);

“Rates Policy” means the policy on the levying of rates on rateable properties of the Emnambithi/Ladysmith Municipality, contemplated in Chapter 2 of the Municipal Property Rates Act.

2. OBJECTS

The object of this Bylaw is to give effect to the implementation of the Rates Policy as contemplated in Section 6 of the Municipal Property Rates Act.

3. ADOPTION AND IMPLEMENTATION OF RATES POLICY

- 3.1 The Municipality shall adopt and implement its Rates Policy consistent with the Municipal Property Rates Act on the levying of rates on rateable property within the jurisdiction of the Municipality; and
- 3.2 The Municipality shall not be entitled to levy rates other than in terms of its Rates Policy.

4. CONTENTS OF RATES POLICY

The Rates Policy shall, *inter alia*:

- 4.1. Apply to all rates levied by the Municipality pursuant to the adoption of its Annual Budget;
- 4.2 Comply with the requirements for:
- 4.2.1. the adoption and contents of a Rates Policy specified in Section 3 of the Act;
 - 4.2.2. the process of community participation specified in Section 4 of the Act; and
 - 4.2.3. the annual review of a Rates Policy specified in Section 5 of the Act.
- 4.3 Provide for principles, criteria and implementation measures that are consistent with the Municipal Property Rates Act for the levying of rates which the Council may adopt; and
- 4.4 Provide for enforcement mechanisms that are consistent with the Municipal Property Rates Act and the Local Government: Municipal Systems Act, 2000 (Act No 32 of 2000).

5. ENFORCEMENT OF THE RATES POLICY

The Municipality's Rates Policy shall be enforced through the Credit Control and Debt Collection Policy and any further enforcement mechanisms stipulated in the Act and the Municipality's Rates Policy.

6. SHORT TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT

This Bylaw is called the Municipal Property Rates Bylaw, and takes effect on 1 July 2014.

2. Notices can only be submitted in Adobe electronic form format to the email submission address submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za. This means that any notice submissions not on an Adobe electronic form that are submitted to this mailbox will be **rejected**. National or Provincial gazette notices, where the Z95 or Z95Prov must be an Adobe form but the notice content (body) will be an attachment.
3. Notices brought into GPW by "walk-in" customers on electronic media can only be submitted in Adobe electronic form format. This means that any notice submissions not on an Adobe electronic form that are submitted by the customer on electronic media will be **rejected**. National or Provincial gazette notices, where the Z95 or Z95Prov must be an Adobe form but the notice content (body) will be an attachment.
4. All customers who walk in to GPW that wish to submit a notice that is not on an electronic Adobe form will be routed to the Contact Centre where the customer will be taken through the completion of the form by a GPW representative. Where a customer walks into GPW with a stack of hard copy notices delivered by a messenger on behalf of a newspaper the messenger must be referred back to the sender as the submission does not adhere to the submission rules.
5. All notice submissions that do not comply with point 2 will be charged full price for the notice submission.
6. The current cut-off of all Gazette's remains unchanged for all channels. (Refer to the GPW website for submission deadlines – www.gpwonline.co.za)
7. Incorrectly completed forms and notices submitted in the wrong format will be rejected to the customer to be corrected and resubmitted. Assistance will be available through the Contact Centre should help be required when completing the forms. (012-748 6200 or email info.egazette@gpw.gov.za)
8. All re-submissions by customers will be subject to the above cut-off times.
9. All submissions and re-submissions that miss the cut-off will be rejected to the customer to be submitted with a new publication date.
10. Information on forms will be taken as the primary source of the notice to be published. Any instructions that are on the email body or covering letter that contradicts the notice form content will be ignored.

You are therefore advised that effective from **Monday, 18 May 2015** should you not comply with our new rules of engagement, all notice requests will be rejected by our new system.

Furthermore, the fax number **012- 748 6030** will also be **discontinued** from this date and customers will only be able to submit notice requests through the email address submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za.
