PUBLICATION OF EXPLANATORY SUMMARY OF THE EDUCATION  
LAWS AMENDMENT BILL, 2007

The Education Laws Amendment Bill, 2007, provides for-

The amendment of the National Education Policy Act, 1996, so as to amend the provision for the establishment of consultative bodies; the amendment of the South African Schools Act, 1996, so as to provide for norms and standards for infrastructure and capacity in public schools, the functions and responsibilities of a principal, random search and seizure at schools, and the substitution for "Public Accountants' and Auditors' Act, 1991" of "Auditing Profession Act, 2005"; the amendment of the National Student Financial Aid Scheme Act, 1999, so as to extend the functions of the board to cover eligible students at public further education and training colleges; the amendment of the South African Council of Educators Act, 2000, the Adult Basic Education and Training Act, 2000, and the General and Further Education and Training Quality Assurance Act, 2001, so as to make technical adjustment that result from the repeal of the Further Education and Training Act, 1998; and for matters connected therewith.
