### SOUTH AFRICAN SCHOOLS ACT, 1996 (ACT NO 84 of 1996)

#### NATIONAL NORMS AND STANDARDS FOR SCHOOL FUNDING

I, Grace Naledi Mandisa Pandor, Minister of Education, in terms of Section 39(7) of the South African Schools Act, 1996 (Act No. 84 of 1996), hereby, determine national quintiles 1 and 2 (40% of the public-school learners nationally) to be used by the Education Member of the Executive Council (MEC) in a province to identify the specific schools in the province that may not charge school fees (that will be no-fee schools as contemplated in section 39(9) of the South African Schools Act, 1996) in 2008. A breakdown of the 40% of learners in national quintiles 1 and 2 for 2008 is given below, per province:
