INVITATION FOR REPRESENTATIONS FROM RELEVANT STAKEHOLDERS ON PROPOSED MORATORIUM UNDER SECTION 49(1) OF THE MINERAL AND PETROLEUM RESOURCES DEVELOPMENT ACT (ACT No. 28 OF 2002) AGAINST RECEIVING OF NEW APPLICATIONS FOR PROSPECTING RIGHTS IN TERMS OF SECTION 16 OF THE ACT FOR A PERIOD OF SIX (06) MONTHS, (FROM 1 SEPTEMBER 2010 UNTIL 28 FEBRUARY 2011)

The Minister of Mineral Resources intends to impose a moratorium under Section 49(1) of the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act, 2002 (Act 28 of 2002), on the receiving of all new applications for prospecting rights in terms of section 16 of the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act, 2002, for a period of six months with effect from 1 September 2010 until 28 February 2011.

The intended moratorium will be applicable to all new applications for prospecting rights only, and will not affect the processing of existing prospecting and mining right applications received before the 01 September 2010, or the renewal thereof.

The purpose of the intended moratorium is to evaluate and implement the findings of a comprehensive audit of all applications received and processed by the Department since 1 May 2004, thereby ensuring the transfer of accurate and reliable data to a new integrated electronic application administrative system. This will streamline and strengthen the administrative process, and will allow for the accurate and instant tracking of applications, thereby improving service delivery.
