HEALTH PROFESSIONS COUNCIL OF SOUTH AFRICA REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION OF MEDICAL TECHNICIANS IN THE CATEGORY IMMUNOLOGY

The Minister of Health has, in terms of section 24 and 25 of the Health Professions Act, 1974 (Act No. 56 of 1974), and on the recommendations of the Health Professions Council of South Africa, made the regulations in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Definitions

1. In this Schedule, and any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act shall have that meaning, unless the context otherwise indicates—

“**professional board**” means the Professional Board for Medical Technology established by Government Notice No. R. 75 of 16 January 1998 in terms of section 15 (1) of the Act,

“**the Act**” means the Health Professions Act, 1974 (Act No. 56 of 1974),

Qualification as a requirement for registration

2. The registrar may register as a medical technician in the category Immunology any person who holds an appropriate qualification in the category Immunology granted after examination by any institution or examining authority approved by the professional board which includes practical experience obtained under supervision of an appropriately qualified practitioner in an accredited training institution as prescribed for this purpose by the professional board: Provided that no qualification shall be accepted for

the purpose of this regulation unless the training thereof has extended over a minimum period of two years in the institution approved by the professional board.


3. The registrar may register as a medical technician in the category immunology any person who has passed an examination, in the category immunology, conducted by the professional board in terms of section 15B (1) (b) of the Act.

Information required for registration

4. Where, the qualification on which an application is based has not yet been approved by the professional board, the applicant shall be required to furnish the professional board at his or her cost with authoritative information as to the education and training required for such qualification. If the standard of such education and training is considered satisfactory and, upon complying with such requirements and passing such examination(s) as the professional board may determine, such applicant may be registered by the registrar.

Short title

5. These Regulations are called Regulations Relating to the Registration of Medical Technicians in the Category Immunology, made in terms of the Health Professions Act, 1974 (Act No. 56 of 1974).

RAAD VIR GESONDHEIDSBEROEPE VAN SUID-AFRIKA
REGULASIES BETREFFENDE DIE REGISTRASIE VAN MEDIESE TEGNICI IN
DIE KATEGORIE IMMUNOLOGIE

Die Minister van Gesondheid het ingevolge artikels 24 en 25 van die Wet op Gesondheidsberoepe, 1974 (Wet No. 56 van 1974), en op aanbeveling van die Raad vir Gesondheidsberoepe van Suid-Afrika, die regulasies in die Bylae uitgevaardig.

BYLAE

Woordomskrywing

1. In hierdie Bylae het enige uitdrukking waaraan daar in die Wet 'n betekenis geheg is, daardie betekenis, en, tensy uit die samehang anders blyk, beteken—

"beroepsraad" die Beroepsraad vir Mediese Tegnologie ingestel by Goewermentskennisgewing No. R. 75 van 16 Januarie 1998 ingevolge artikel 15(1) van die Wet;

"die Wet" die Wet op Gesondheidsberoepe, 1974 (Wet No. 56 van 1974).

Kwalifikasie as vereiste vir registrasie

2. Die registrateur kan enige persoon registreer as 'n mediese tegnikus in die kategorie immunologie wat 'n toepaslike kwalifikasie in dié kategorie besit, wat verwerf is ná eksaminering deur 'n instansie of eksamineringsowerheid wat deur die beroepsraad goedgekeur is, wat praktiese ondervinding insluit wat onder toesig van 'n gepas gekwalifiseerde praktisyn in 'n geakkrediteerde opleidingsinstansie verkry is, soos vir hierdie doel deur die beroepsraad voorgeskryf: Met dien verstande dat geen kwalifikasie vir die doel van hierdie

regulasie aanvaar moet word nie, tensy die onderrig daarvan gestrek het oor 'n minimum tydperk van twee jaar in die instansie wat deur die beroepsraad goedgekeur is.

3. Die registrateur kan enige persoon registreer as 'n mediese tegnikus in die kategorie immunologie wat 'n eksamen in dié kategorie geslaag het wat die beroepsraad ingevolge artikel 15B(1)(b) van die Wet afgeneem het.

Inligting vereis vir registrasie

4. Waar die kwalifikasie waarop 'n aansoek berus nog nie deur die beroepsraad goedgekeur is nie, word daar van die aansoeker vereis om die beroepsraad op sy/haar eie koste te voorsien van gesaghebbende inligting aangaande die onderrig en opleiding wat vir sodanige kwalifikasie vereis word. Indien die standaard van sodanige onderrig en opleiding as bevredigend beskou word, en by voldoening aan sodanige vereistes en die slaag van sodanige eksamen/s wat die beroepsraad kan bepaal, kan so 'n aansoeker deur die registrateur geregistreer word.

Kort titel

5. Hierdie regulasies heet die *Regulasies betreffende die registrasie van mediese tegnisi in die kategorie immunologie*, uitgevaardig ingevolge die Wet op Gesondheidsberoepe, 1974.
