

1. LEGAL BASIS FOR THE INQUIRY

- 1.1. The Competition Commission ("the Commission") will conduct a market inquiry into the supply and distribution of Liquefied Petroleum Gas ("LPG") in South Africa in terms of Chapter 4A¹ of the Competition Act, No. 89 of 1998 (as amended) ("the Act") and in keeping with the purpose and functions of the Commission as set out in section 2 and section 21 of the Act respectively. Section 21 of the Act calls on the Commission to, inter alia, "implement measures to increase market transparency" and "advise, and receive advice from, any regulatory authority". In order to fulfil these functions, and in line with the purpose of the Act, Chapter 4A of the Act enables the Commission to conduct market inquiries in respect of the "general state of competition in a market for particular goods or services, without necessarily referring to the conduct or activities of any particular named firm".² A market inquiry is thus a general investigation into the state, nature and form of competition in a market, rather than a narrow investigation of specific conduct by any particular firm.
- 1.2. The Commission is initiating an inquiry into the LPG sector because it has reason to believe that there are features of the sector that prevent, distort or restrict competition. The Commission further believes that conducting this inquiry will assist it in understanding how it may promote competition in the LPG sector, in furtherance of the purpose of the Act. One of the prerequisites to commence a market inquiry is that the Commission must develop and publish Terms of Reference ("ToR") for the market inquiry. These ToR must include, "at a minimum, a statement of the scope of the inquiry and the time within which it is expected to be completed. In accordance with these provisions, this ToR sets out the scope of the market inquiry, as well as the expected timelines for the inquiry.
- 1.3. Although the ToR delimits the scope of the market inquiry as currently envisaged, additional and related matters not identified herein may arise during the conduct of the inquiry. If the Commission believes that the ToR should be amended in any way, either through the addition of new matters or exclusion of matters currently identified herein, the ToR may be amended in terms of section 43B (5) of the Act.

2. PRODUCT OVERVIEW

- 2.1. LPG is a liquefied and mixed gaseous hydrocarbon.³ Although there are many variations of LPG, it is primarily made up of propane (60%) and butane (40%) which are compressed into liquid form for ease of transport, storage and handling.⁴ LPG is produced as part of a chemical process either as a by-product of the refinery process or it can be extracted "from oil or 'wet' natural gas streams as they emerge from the ground".⁵ It can also be produced by blending the two ingredients together. It is stored in tanks, mainly in liquid form and transported by road tanker trucks or in cylinders. LPG is used in many applications, however, the basic product is homogenous in the sense that the physical features and the quality of the product supplied by each supplier is the same.
- 2.2. LPG is primarily used as a thermal fuel and is consumed by industrial, commercial and household consumers. It burns cleanly, releasing very few sulphur emissions, and posing no ground or water pollution hazards. There are over a thousand applications of LPG particularly in commercial and industrial businesses. In particular, LPG is used in the following industries:
 - 2.2.1. <u>Industrial customers</u>: for heating purposes where a readily controlled temperature is needed, i.e. motor vehicle paint shops or as fuel for fork lift trucks within warehouses etc.
 - 2.2.2. <u>Commercial</u>: This includes, for example, a shopping centre with a number of restaurants which may have one bulk tank with LPG reticulated to individual restaurants/stores.
 - 2.2.3. <u>Autogas</u>: LPG can also be used to power motor vehicles. Vehicles that use autogas are fitted with two fuel tanks, one for autogas and another for petrol/diesel. The vehicle can therefore switch between autogas and petrol/diesel at any time.⁶

- 2.2.4. Households: LPG is mainly used by households for heating and cooking. Recently, residential estates have also started installing LPG reticulation systems supplying gas into the different properties inside these estates.⁷
- 2.3. There are various possible substitutes for LPG depending on the intended end use. These include natural gas, electricity, biomass (wood), fossil fuel (coal) and solar equipment. LPG generally differentiates itself from other energy sources on the basis of portability, convenience, low sulphur content, controllability and its clean burning nature. The confines of the market will become clearer during and after the market inquiry however the Competition Tribunal ("Tribunal") has previously accepted a distinct market for LPG separate from other sources of energy.9

3. THE SOUTH AFRICAN LPG SECTOR

- Approximately 300 000 tons of LPG is manufactured and sold in South Africa 3.1. annually generating a turnover of about R1.5 billion. The sector is however still characterised by limited supply with imports supplementing the domestic supply. Most of the LPG produced in South Africa is consumed by industrial users such as manufacturing plants and commercial users such as shopping centres with only marginal quantities consumed by households. Only about 3% of households in South Africa use LPG as their main energy source for cooking. 10 The wholesaling of LPG is relatively capital intensive and requires investment in bulk transporters tankers, bulk storage facilities, cylinder filling plant, cylinders, cylinder delivery vehicles and installation on customer's premises. 11
- 3.2. The LPG sector is highly regulated mainly to ensure the safety of both suppliers and end-users as the gas is hazardous. The Occupational and Health and Safety Act (No. 85 of 1993 as amended), which is enforced by the Department of

Labour, and other fire safety regulations and municipal by-laws, have made provisions which ensure that the safety component of LPG receives priority. The Department of Energy ("DoE") also sets strict regulations which ensure that infrastructure used to import and transport imported LPG meets the safety requirements of the country.

- 3.3. In addition to safety regulation, the price of LPG is also regulated at certain levels of the value chain in terms of the Petroleum Products Act, (No. 120 of 1977, as amended) ("PPA"). The DoE regulates the Maximum Refinery Gate Price of LPG ("MRGP") which is the price at which refineries sell LPG. The MRGP is also designed to support the importation of LPG.¹²
- 3.4. One of the biggest factors affecting the price of LPG is the price of crude oil. The volatility of the crude oil price causes constant fluctuations in the price of LPG.¹³ The LPG industry faces shortages from time to time, mainly in the winter months, largely due to unplanned shutdowns of refineries, late start-up after planned maintenance and limited storage facilities. Notwithstanding the shortages, importing is challenging as import facilities are limited and there are suggestions that imports are uneconomic at the MRGP.
- 3.5. The storage of LPG (outside of refineries) is licensed and regulated by the National Energy Regulator of South Africa ("NERSA"). NERSA regulates LPG marine loading facilities, pipelines and storage facilities when LPG is in liquid form.
- 3.6. The domestic LPG value chain includes refineries, distributors/resellers, retailers and other stockists. The diagram below shows the different levels of the value chain before they are discussed thereafter:

3.7. The Refineries

- 3.7.1. There are six refineries in South Africa dispersed across the country. Not all the refineries in South Africa produce LPG. As noted above, LPG is regulated at this level of the value chain by DoE which sets the MRGP. The Commission understands that the refineries allocate a certain proportion of their total LPG supply to wholesalers. The Commission has identified the following refineries producing LPG in South Africa:
 - 3.7.1.1. Shell and BP South African Petroleum Refineries Proprietary Limited (SAPREF) (Durban).
 - 3.7.1.2. Sasol Gas Limited Synfuels (CTL¹⁴) (Secunda).
 - 3.7.1.3. The Petroleum Oil and Gas Corporation of South Africa (Pty) Ltd (PETROSA) (GLT¹⁵) (Mossel Bay).
 - 3.7.1.4. Engen Petroleum Limited (ENREF) (Durban).
 - 3.7.1.5. Chevron South Africa (Pty) Ltd (CHEVREF) (Cape Town).

3.7.2. LPG is also imported into South Africa via three small import facilities located in Richard's Bay, Port Elizabeth and Durban.¹⁶

3.8. Resellers/Distributers

- 3.8.1. Major Resellers (MR's), according to the Petroleum Products Act 1977 ("PPA") are firms that play a distribution role for bulk LPG, either distributing it in bulk or repackaging LPG to better suit customer demands. Bulk LPG is purchased by the MR's, either from the oil refineries or imports. The LPG is then transported either by rail or road to three possible destinations, namely:
 - 3.8.1.1. Directly to industrial and commercial end-user. These customers would generally store the LPG in bulk storage tanks provided by the MR on their premises. The supply to commercial entities often involves the reticulation of LPG to multiple end-users through a system of pipes connected to one or more storage tanks. Generally, the MR would also provide other equipment such as vaporizers, firefighting equipment and gas meters.
 - 3.8.1.2. The MR's storage facilities and/or cylinder filing plants located in different parts of the country. The primary use of LPG supplied to these facilities would be to fill the cylinders at an adjacent filling plant owned by the MR. The cylinders are then supplied to commercial customers and end-users in LPG cylinders. Alternatively the LPG is supplied by the MR from the storage facility to bulk LPG industrial and commercial end-users such as shopping centres.
 - 3.8.1.3. LPG is stored in equipment supplied by the MR at the premises of the retailer who then fill the LPG into gas cylinders. All equipment, including filling platforms, cylinder filling scales, fire extinguishing equipment and ancillary equipment required to fill the gas cylinders is provided by the MR. LPG cylinders are then sold off to individual endusers and private households.

3.8.2. The Commission also understands that there are firms which trade at this level of the market that are not 'conventional' wholesalers of LPG. These firms, referred to as 'brokers', receive an allocation of LPG from the refineries and on-sell this (the allocation) to the wholesalers. These firms therefore do not participate actively in the wholesaling of LPG but rather play the role of an intermediary between refineries and wholesalers in instances where they have managed to secure allocation. Due to the shortages in LPG supply, the role played by these firms will be explored during the market inquiry in as far as it affects the competitive dynamics at the wholesale level.

3.9. Retailers

- 3.9.1. LPG is sold at the retail level in cylinders mainly used by household customers. This level of the market is largely fragmented with LPG being sold from a variety of outlets such as filling stations, grocery supermarkets and hardware stores. The Commission has provisionally identified the following dynamics at this level of the value chain:
 - 3.9.1.1. LPG is supplied in branded cylinders by the resellers to retailers who on-sell to end-users.
 - 3.9.1.2. LPG retailers are usually contracted and branded to a particular producer or wholesaler who owns storage and filling equipment. This is particularly the case for filling stations affiliated with the vertically integrated refineries.
 - 3.9.1.3. LPG usually yields a small portion of the turnover for most of these outlets and has small margins because the price is regulated.
 - 3.9.1.4. Transportation and storage costs in the supply chain result in higher prices to consumers however the small size of the market has not warranted larger-scale infrastructural investment for importation or local optimisation and distribution of bulk LPG.
- 3.9.2. The demand for LPG in South Africa seems to be growing as more end-users diversify their energy mix in response to, amongst others, the power shortfalls

and increasing electricity price.¹⁷ LPG has been identified as an alternative energy carrier for the provision of quick and effective solutions to energy requirements.

4. RATIONALE FOR THE MARKET INQUIRY

4.1. Structural features of the market

- 4.1.1. LPG is manufactured by the refineries as a by-product of the process of producing fuel. The sector is characterised by limited supply with imports supplementing the domestic supply. The limited domestic supply of LPG is a concern for several reasons:
 - 4.1.1.1. The strategic importance of being able to secure LPG can also be seen in the emergence of firms referred to as 'brokers' who are firms that trade in LPG refinery allocations.
 - 4.1.1.2. As LPG is currently imported at very limited quantities, this suggests that imports are not providing a competitive constraint to the LPG supplied by the refineries and distributed by the resellers.

4.2. High switching costs

4.2.1. The LPG sector may be characterised by high switching costs. This may be, in part, due to the uncertainty that surrounds the current sourcing practises in the market when customers first make the decision to: a) use LPG as a source of energy and b) choose a particular firm to supply the customer with LPG. LPG supply for commercial and industrial customers is mainly done through the use of a bulk LPG tanks distributing LPG to various points around the facility through a complex reticulation system. In most instances, this reticulation system is provided by the chosen supplier of LPG on the understanding that the supplier will have exclusive rights to supply LPG for the customer.

4.2.2. The difficulty appears to arise at a later stage if a customer seeks to make the decision to switch to another supplier. It appears unclear as to who ownership of the reticulation system should cede to. This is exasperated by the fact that these complex systems are generally built into walls at the customer's premises. There appears to be uncertainty when consideration is made of the safety aspect of the ownership and operation of reticulation systems. The Commission will consider whether the uncertainty that surrounds reticulation systems when customers seek to switch to alternative suppliers of LPG creates a restriction to competition in the market, by artificially raising switching costs. It may be possible that this creates barriers to entry and expansion for smaller distributers.

4.3. The regulatory environment

4.3.1. There is price regulation at the refinery level of the market (MGRP) and at the retail level (cylinders) however the wholesale price of LPG is not regulated. The impact of lack of regulation at the wholesale level will be explored in the inquiry to assess if this creates any competition distortion. The current regulatory environment does not encourage switching between MRs which may serve to inhibit competition at that level of the value chain. The current safety regulation framework appears to favour the continued ownership of reticulation systems used by customers by MRs. By conflating the safe use of a reticulation system with its ownership, the regulatory framework may serve to increase switching costs between MRs of LPG.

4.4. LPG as a strategic energy source

- 4.4.1. The government through the National Development Plan and National Growth Path has identified LPG as being of strategic importance in an economy struggling with rising energy prices and an electricity supply under severe pressure.¹⁸
- 4.4.2. LPG is currently underutilised in South Africa as an energy source; only 3% of households in South Africa use LPG as their main energy source for

cooking.¹⁹ The limited supply and the relatively high price of LPG may serve to keep its usage low.²⁰ In order for South Africa to meet its strategic objectives as far as sustainable energy is concerned, it is important that the LPG sector is functioning effectively with consideration given to how competition principles may shape efficient market outcomes which will benefit the economy in general but also low-income households in particular.

5. PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES OF THE MARKET INQUIRY

- 5.1. The purpose of the market inquiry is:
 - 5.1.1. To examine whether there are features of the market which lessen, prevent or distort competition.
 - 5.1.2. To establish a factual basis for making recommendations to the relevant stakeholders on the state of competition in the sector.
- 5.2. The main objectives of the market inquiry are to:
 - 5.2.1. To examine whether the supply bottlenecks in the LPG sector may serve to create circumstances or incentives that serve to distort, prevent or lessen competition.
 - 5.2.2. To analyse the current price regulatory framework and its impact on competition in the sector.
 - 5.2.3. To examine whether the current features of the market increase switching costs to a prohibitive level.
 - 5.2.4. To assess the competition dynamics at various levels of the value chain.
 - 5.2.5. To make recommendations (if any) that may serve to improve the state of competition.

6. THE PROPOSED MARKET INQUIRY PROCESS AND TIMELINES

6.1. Market inquiry process

- 6.1.1. The Commission will evaluate the subject matter of the inquiry through a review of secondary material obtained via information requests, consultations and summons, as required. For the purposes of the inquiry, the methods that may be used for gathering information may include the following:
 - 6.1.1.1. Questionnaires and surveys to identified participants or to the general public.
 - 6.1.1.2. Information requests to particular market participants.
 - 6.1.1.3. Calls for submissions on issues relevant to the market inquiry.
 - 6.1.1.4. Targeted meetings with key industry stakeholders.
- 6.1.2. The inquiry will be carried out by a team of the Commission's staff.
- 6.1.3. The participants in the market inquiry process will include: business enterprises along the LPG value chain (including manufacturers, wholesalers/distributers and retailers), other related business enterprises, end-users, government departments, public entities, regulatory authorities, industry associations, and any other stakeholder that may be able to provide information relevant to the market inquiry. Members of the public will be invited to participate in the inquiry during the information gathering phase. Members of the public are encouraged to participate fully in the inquiry process.
- 6.1.4. The Commission is committed to the principles of fairness, transparency, and integrity and will conduct the inquiry in accordance with these principles. The Commission will allow stakeholders fair and reasonable opportunity to provide input into the inquiry process and its outcomes. Therefore, the Commission will take reasonable steps to ensure that interested parties understand the Commission's thinking on the market inquiry as it develops. For this reason and its commitment to transparency, the Commission may release interim reports throughout the market inquiry for public consideration and comment.
- 6.1.5. The Commission will release a report at the conclusion of the market inquiry.

6.1.6. The market inquiry will be carried out in three phases.²¹ These are detailed below:22

"a common bond" exists between-

(a)

- members of a Financial Co-operative, Financial Services Cooperative, Credit Union or Savings and Credit Co-operative which members—
 - a. consist of persons who are employed by common employer(s) or who are employed within the same business district; or
 - b. have common membership in an association or organisation, including religious, social, co-operative, labour or educational groups; or
 - c. reside within the same defined community within a rural or urban district.
- ii. members of a secondary financial co-operative consisting of primary financial co-operatives registered in terms of paragraph 3 (a) below.
- (b) members of a specific group consisting of employees of the same employer who are members of the same savings and credit scheme that is operated and administered on behalf of such group of employees in accordance with set rules agreed upon between such group of employees and their employer; or
- (c) members of a specific group that may be described by the term or concept known as "stokvel", which
 - is a formal or informal rotating credit scheme with entertainment, social and economic functions;
 - ii. fundamentally consists of members who have pledged mutual support to each other towards the attainment of specific objectives;
 - iii. establishes a continuous pool of capital by raising funds by means of the subscriptions of members;
 - iv. grants credit to and on behalf of members;
 - v. provides for members to share in profits and to nominate management; and
 - vi. relies on self-imposed regulation to protect the interest of its members; or

(d) members of a specific group, governed in terms of rules agreed to and signed by the group's founders, exclusively established for the purpose of raising funds and applying or holding available such funds for housing advances to members, irrespective of whether or not such group is bound by its rules to terminate upon the expiration of a fixed period or upon the occurrence of an event specified in its rules.

"employee" means any person who is employed by or working for an employer and is receiving or entitled to receive any remuneration;

"employer" means any person whosoever employs or provides work for any person and remunerates or expressly or tacitly undertakes to remunerate him;

"group" means a number of natural persons;

"member", in relation to a group as mentioned in subparagraph (a), (b), (c) and (d), means a person who contributes towards the funding of the group in order to obtain any benefit in terms thereof.

"co-operative financial institution" means any of the entities referred to in subparagraph (a) of the definition of "common bond" above;

"other savings groups", means groups referred to in subparagraph (b),(c) and (d) of definition of "common bond" above; and

"CBDA", means the Co-operative Banks Development Agency, established under section 54 of the Co-operative Banks Act, Act No 40 of 2007.

2. Designated activity-

- 2.1. Subject to the conditions set out in paragraph 3, a co-operative financial institution may only provide, participate in or undertake the following services:
 - (a) solicit and accept money from members;
 - (b) open savings accounts for its members, in the name of each member, into which that member may deposit or withdraw money and from which that member may instruct the co-operative financial institution to transfer or pay money;
 - borrow money from other organisation including government agencies and banking institutions up to a percentage of the assets held by it as prescribed by the CBDA;
 - (d) open a savings account or cheque account in the name of that cooperative financial institution with any banking institution;
 - (e) grant secured and unsecured loans to members to a maximum aggregate value prescribed by the CBDA;
 - (f) conduct any additional services as may be prescribed by the CBDA, which services shall be limited to those prescribed under section 14 of the Co-operative Banks Act, Act No 40 of 2007; and
 - (g) Invest money from its members in investments prescribed by the CBDA.

- 2.2. Subject to the conditions set out in paragraph 3, other savings groups may accept by or on behalf of a group, between the members of which there exists a common bond, money from such members, the pooling of such money, and the utilisation thereof for one or more of the following objectives:
 - (a) The contribution to maintenance during minority, old age, widowhood, sickness or other infirmity, whether bodily or mental, of members or their husbands, wives, widows, widowers, children or other relatives or dependants;
 - (b) the granting of annuities, whether immediate or deferred, to members or to nominees of members or the endowment of members or nominees of members:
 - (c) the provision of a sum of money to be paid or other benefit to be provided
 - i. on the birth of a member's child;
 - ii. on the death of a member or any other person mentioned in paragraph (a) or in the form of an endowment insurance on the life of a member or such a person;
 - iii. towards the expenses in connection with the death or funeral of any member or any such person; or
 - iv. during a period of confined mourning by a member or such a person;
 - (d) the acquisition of movable goods by a member;
 - (e) the acquisition of any land by a member;
 - (f) the erection, on any land, of buildings for residential or business purposes or the acquisition of any such buildings by a member;
 - (g) the insurance against fire or other contingencies of the implements of the trade or calling of any member;
 - (h) towards expenses in connection with any recreational or social event of a member;
 - (i) the provision of a sum of money to a member on a member's leaving the services of his employer owing to dismissal, resignation or otherwise;
 - (j) the relief or maintenance of members, or any group of members, when unemployed or in distressed circumstances;
 - (k) the provision of money for the advancement of the education or training of members or of the children of members;
 - (I) the establishment of any business by a member;
 - (m) the development of the community to which the members belong;
 - (n) the provision of means whereby members may receive interest or a dividend on their respective contributions or subscriptions.

- 3. **Conditions.**—the following conditions are applicable to co-operative financial institutions and other savings groups, namely:-
 - (a) a co-operative financial institution shall at all times subject itself to the requirements of the Cooperatives Act, No 14 of 2005 and the supervision and regulation of the CBDA. The CBDA may delegate any such function or duty or part thereof to a representative body or support organisation accredited by the CBDA in terms of the Co-operatives Banks Act, Act No 40 of 2007.
 - (b) in case of stokvels, they shall be a member of a self-regulatory body approved by the Registrar of Banks in writing, which names may be listed on the official website of the South African Reserve Bank. Such bodies must issue a certificate of registration to its members. Stokvels that do not at any time hold contributions from members amounting in the aggregate to more than R100 000 need not register with such bodies;
 - (c) none of the activities of a co-operative financial institution and other savings groups may fall within the objectives of a pension fund organisation as set out in paragraph (a) or (b) of the definition of "pension fund organisation" in section 1 of the Pension Funds Act, 1956;
 - (d) the rules of a co-operative financial institution and other savings groups shall not entitle any member at any time, albeit subject to any such notice as may be prescribed in the rules of a co-operative financial institution and other savings groups, to withdraw the full amount of his or her contributions;
 - (e) the benefits of members of the co-operative financial institution and other savings group shall not be provided exclusively by way of loans that, in terms of the rules of a co-operative financial institution and other savings groups, must be repaid;
 - (f) a co-operative financial institution and other savings groups shall keep, in one of the official languages of the Republic of South Africa, such accounting records as are necessary to fairly reflect the state of affairs and business of a co-operative financial institution and other savings groups and to explain the transactions and financial position of such co-operative financial institution and other savings groups;
 - (g) a co-operative financial institution and other savings groups shall fix a date on which, in each year, its financial year will end, and such financial year shall be its annual accounting period;
 - (h) a co-operative financial institution and other savings groups shall within 120 days after the end of each financial year cause annual financial statements, pertaining to its affairs and business in respect of that financial year, to be made out in one of the official languages of the Republic of South Africa;
 - (i) subject to the provisions of (j) and (k) below, co-operative financial institutions and other savings groups may not at any time hold contributions from members amounting in the aggregate to more than R30 million.
 - (j) co-operative financial institutions that have reached the limit mentioned in (i) above must apply to the CBDA in writing for approval to hold contributions from members to an amount not exceeding R40 million in aggregate.

- (k) applications in terms of (j) above must be received by the CBDA within 60 days from the date of the publication of this notice.
- (I) the financial statements of a co-operative financial institution shall be presented in accordance with the Co-operatives Act, Act No 14 of 2005;
- (m) the financial statements of other savings groups that at any time hold contributions from members amounting in the aggregate to more than R3 million must be presented to a person duly registered as an accountant and auditor, in terms of the Auditing Professions Act, 2005 (Act No. 26 of 2005), for purposes of the drawing up and presentation of a report. In the event of the accountant and auditor being unable to make such report or to make it without qualification, he shall include in his report a statement to that effect and set forth the facts or circumstances that prevent him from so making his report or from making it without qualification;
- (n) copies of such financial statements shall within 60 days after completion thereof also be presented
 - i. in the case of a co-operative financial institution to the members of such cooperative financial institution and to the CBDA in writing.
 - ii. in case of other savings groups
 - a. a group mentioned in subparagraph (b) of paragraph 1, to the members of such group and to their employer; or
 - b. a group mentioned in subparagraph (c) of paragraph 1, to the members of such group and, if applicable, to the relevant self-regulatory body approved by the Registrar in writing; or
 - c. a group mentioned in subparagraph (d) of paragraph 1, to the members of such group.
- 4. Reporting The Office of the Registrar of Banks may request written information from CBDA or self-regulatory bodies on their activities and the activities of the institutions supervised by them.
- **5.** Repeal of notice Government Notice No. 404 published in Government Gazette No 35368 of 25 May 2012 is hereby repealed and substituted by this notice.

FOREWORD BY THE MINISTER

South Africa is one of the many State Parties that ratified the World Heritage Conventionin order to protect her incredible natural resources, biodiversity and cultural heritage. Currently 8 properties are already inscribed on the World Heritage List because of their Outstanding Universal Value. World Heritage Properties have the potential to generate economic benefits and improve the lives of the communal society.

Our greatest highlights since the ratification of this Convention, includes the promulgation of the World Heritage Convention Act, 1999 (Act 49 of 1999), being nominated to serve as one of the 21 member state parties constituting the World Heritage Committee, inscription of 8 World Heritage properties on the World Heritage List, establishment of the South African World Heritage Convention Committee and successfully hosting the 29th session of the World Heritage Committee in 2005 and recently hosting two significant events commemorating the 40th Anniversary of the Convention (Expert workshop and International Conference for the Africa Region).

The road has not been an easy one as we have experienced a number of hurdles along the way. These include development pressures in the form of infrastructure, mining, poor conservation management, lack of financial resources and many other issues hindering sustainable livelihoods and adequate preservation of our heritage. All these challenges are a result of planning that can be improved.

In order to address these challenges, the State Party has developed a Procedure Document for nominations outlining key requirements for both the tentative listing and nomination process. This procedure is in addition to the existing flow process and information outlined in the Operational Guidelines of the World Heritage Convention. Through this Procedure, the State Party will ensure that the nominated properties have effective conservation and management provisions in place.

INTRODUCTION

The General Conference of the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (Unesco) meeting in Paris from 17 October to 21 November 1972, at its seventeenth session, adopted the Convention Concerning the Protection of the World Cultural and Natural Heritage. The main purpose of the Convention was to give the international community an opportunity to contribute in the protection of the cultural and natural heritage of Outstanding Universal Value (OUV).

In acknowledgement of the importance of heritage, South Africa (also referred hereunder as the State Party) ratified the Convention in 1997 and subsequently translated it into domestic law through the promulgation of the World Heritage Convention Act, 1999 (49 of 1999) (WHCA).

To give impetus to effective protection of the world heritage properties within the boundaries of the State Party, the National Environmental Management: Protected Areas, 2003 (Act 57 of 2003) as amended, recognises world heritage properties as protected areas. "A protected area is globally recognised as a clearly defined geographical space, recognised, dedicated and managed, through legal or other effective means, to achieve the long term conservation of nature and associated ecosystem services and cultural values."

Furthermore, the National Heritage Resource Act, 1999 (Act 25 of 1999) (NHRA) provides formal legal protection to sites and objects of cultural significance within the boundaries of the State Party.

The State Party has also established the South African World Heritage Convention Committee (SAWHCC).

Reflecting on achievements to date, the State Party has been very successful with its world heritage nominations. In addition, there are also more properties on the tentative list awaiting formal nominations.

However, the last few years have revealed a number of challenges concerning the conservation and effective management of world heritage properties. Challenges range from inadequate management systems, poor land use management, inadequate conservation management and other types of inappropriate development. Most of the challenges are a direct result of inadequate planning at the time of nomination or inscription to the South African World Heritage Tentative List.

Therefore, a need has been identified to provide guidance to all future world heritage nominations, including those that are currently on the Tentative List. This procedure will enable the State Party to prepare nomination dossiers and ensure that challenges are addressed, or at least mitigated for, before nominations are submitted to Unesco.

Procedure

This document is called the "Procedure for the Nomination of World Heritage Sites in the Republic of South Africa. Nomination of properties to the World Heritage List enables the State Party to fulfil its commitment to the World Heritage Convention (Convention). In addition, it contributes to South Africa's commitment to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) as well as the outcome 10 Delivery Agreements to conserve our biodiversity. It is anticipated that this procedure will assist in ensuring that the State Party's world heritage properties maintain their status on the World Heritage List.

Once listed, these properties must be managed in accordance with international best practice models as well as conform to national legislation. For its part, Unescohas developed the *Operational Guidelines for the Implementation of the World Heritage Convention* (hereunder referred to as Operational Guidelines),to assist State Parties with the implementation of the Convention. Operational Guidelines sets procedures for:

- a) The inscription of properties on the World Heritage List and the List of World Heritage in Danger;
- b) The protection and conservation of World Heritage properties;
- c) The granting of International Assistance under the World Heritage Fund; and
- d) The mobilisation of national and international support in favour of the Convention

It is important to note that the process outlined in the Operational Guidelines remains the primary guide but all nominations will henceforth have to adhere to the national process as outlined herein.

The **World Heritage Convention Act** (WHCA) outlines the national processes that must be followed with the nomination and proclamation of World Heritage properties. Therefore, this procedure should be read together with the Operational Guidelines for the Implementation of the Conventionas well as theWHCA.

A check list (Annexure 1) has been appended to this procedure to assist stakeholders in ensuring that their nominations meet the requirements of the State Party before they can be submitted to Unesco.

PART 1

1.1. LEGISLATIVE FRAMEWORK

The World Heritage Convention Act, 1999 (Act 49 of 1999) is the primary legislation for issues concerning the establishment and management of world heritage properties in the South Africa.

Other relevant legislation, including, without limitation, the Constitution of the Republic of South Africa, 1996, the Intergovernmental Relations Framework Act, 2005 (Act 13 of 2005), the National Environmental Management Act 1998(Act 107 of 1998), the National Environmental Management: Protected Areas Act, 2003 (Act 57 of 2003), the National Environmental Management: Biodiversity Act, 2004 (Act 10 of 2004) and the National Heritage Resources Act, 1999 (Act No. 25 of 1999) will impact on the processes that need to be followed for the nomination of sites.

1.1.1 Definition of a World Heritage property.

Article 1 of the Convention defines cultural heritage as follows:

monuments:

architectural works, works of monumental sculpture and painting, elements or structures of an archaeological nature, inscriptions, cave dwellings and combinations of features, which are of outstanding universal value from the point of view of history, art or science;

groups of buildings: groups of separate or connected buildings which, because of their architecture, their homogeneity or their place in the landscape, are of outstanding universal value from the point of view of history, art or science;

sites:

works of man or the combined works of nature and man, and areas including archaeological sites which are of outstanding universal value from the historical, aesthetic, ethnological or anthropological point of view.

Cultural landscapes

:defined in paragraph 47 of the Operational Guidelines cultural landscape are cultural properties representing the "combined works of nature and of man" as designated in Article 1 of the Convention. They are illustrative of the evolution of human society and settlement over time, under the influence of the physical constraints and/or opportunities presented by their natural environment and of successive social, economic and cultural forces, both external and internal.

Article 2 of the Convention defines natural heritage as follows:

natural features consisting of:

- a) physical and biological formations or groups of such formations, which are of outstanding universal value from the aesthetic or scientific point of view;
- b) geological and physiographical formations and precisely delineated areas which constitute the habitat of threatened species of animals and plants of outstanding universal value from the point of view of science or conservation;
- 1.1.2 Furthermore, Section 1 of the WHCA provides the following definition of a World Heritage Site:
 - (xxiv) any place in the Republic which—
 - (a) has been included on-
 - (i) the World Heritage List; or
 - (ii) the tentative list of the Republic referred to in Article 121(a)(i) of the Operational Guidelines, and is proclaimed by the Minister by notice in the Gazette to be a World Heritage Site; or
 - (b) has been proclaimed by the Minister by notice in the Gazette to be a special World Heritage Site

1.1.3 Responsibility

The WHCA outlines in section 5 that the responsibility to enforce and implement the Convention is the responsibility of the Minister of Water and Environmental Affairs.

Section 5 provides that: "the Minister is responsible for enforcing and implementing this Act and Convention in the Republic".

This means that the inscription of a property in the World Heritage List can only be made at the request and with the consent of the responsible Minister.

1.1.4 World Heritage Nominations

Section 6(1) of the WHCA gives the Minister the powers to prescribe procedure for nomination of world heritage properties. Hence this procedure has been developed in fulfilment of this Section.

1.1.5 Proponents should note that by undertaking activities as outlined in Part 2(Tentative Listing) and Part 3(Nomination dossier) it does not mean that their proposals will be submitted to Unesco as the Minister reserves the right to determine which proposals may be processed further.

PART 2

2.1. TENTATIVE LISTING

The Operational Guidelines for the Implementation of the World Heritage Convention (paragraphs 62 to 76) require State Parties to prepare, maintain and submit to the WHC a Tentative List of properties they intend to nominate to the World Heritage List.

In developing a Tentative List, the following basic requirements should be fulfilled:

- 2.1.1. The Format (Annexure 2) of the Operational Guidelines should be used;
- 2.1.2. Natural heritage properties should be designated as any type of protected area, as outlined in section 9 of NEMPAA;
- 2.1.3. Cultural heritage properties should be have any formal protection provided for in terms of NHRA;
- 2.1.4. Mixed properties and where appropriate cultural landscapes should fulfil 2.1.2. and/or 2.1.3. above;
- 2.1.5. In nominating transboundary properties, the portion of the property that falls outside the Republic of South Africa should enjoy formal protection in accordance with legislation in that particular State Party;
- 2.1.6. Transboundary properties should comply with the above and have full support of both State Parties;
- 2.1.7. Serial properties should be backed by a formal agreement between the responsible Management Authorities (MA) even in cases where there is more than one MA.
- 2.2 In addition to fulfilling basic requirement 2.1.1, nominations to the Tentative List should also address the following management and administrative issues:
 - 2.2.1 Proposed boundary (identifying possible core and buffer zone and or "buffering mechanisms"). See paragraph 104 of the Operational Guidelines including the Unesco Resource Manual known as "Preparing World Heritage Nominations, second edition, 2011" for further elaboration;
 - 2.2.2 All nominations should clearly indicate a proposed buffer zone. Where no buffer zone is indicated, a statement on how the OUV would be protected from outside pressures should be provided;
 - 2.2.3 Land ownership (information to reflect the ownership as recorded in the Deeds Office including the contact details of the registered landowner/s);
 - 2.2.4 Land tenure system (Land claims/ land use activities)
 - 2.2.5 Development plans, if any-infrastructure plans (malls, residential, etc);

- 2.2.6 Stakeholder Consultation (Government, landowners, communities, relevant NGO's, Private Sector, etc);
- 2.2.7 Current management system and proposed administrative structure;
- 2.2.8 State of conservation and current conservation management plans (List all strengths and weaknesses, opportunities and threats);
- 2.2.9 Knowledge management system (i.e. maps, GIS system, inventories, IKS;
- 2.2.10 How this proposed nomination addresses the gaps in the World Heritage list as identified in the Gap Analysis Study of the WHC and UnescoAdvisoryBodies
- 2.2.11 Natural heritage properties to include a statement on how the proposed nomination will address the priorities of government as far as the National Protected Areas Expansion Strategy is concerned
- 2.3 The SAWHCC will assess Tentative List nominations submitted for the purpose of making recommendations to the Minister of those sites which meet the criteria for inclusion on the South African Tentative List.

The SAWHCC will review the South African Tentative List every two years as determined in the *Operational Guidelines* for the implementation of the World Heritage Convention.

The applicants will be required to make presentations on their proposal at any given time as determined by the Department.

PART 3

3.1. NOMINATION DOSSIER

Section 6(3) of the WHCA provides that "any person may submit a proposal in writing to the Department or, if it is in existence, the body referred to in subsection (2) for a place in the Republic to be nominated for inclusion on the World Heritage List".

Proponent must take note of the timetable described in Part 4 of this procedure. Furthermore, they must interact with the SAWHCC through the Department to ensure compliance.

Nomination dossiers should follow the format outlined in Annexure 5 of the Operational Guidelines. The Nomination process is clearly set out in paragraphs 129 to 151 of the Operational Guidelines.

3.1.1. In addition to complying with the Unesco format as set out in annexure 5 of the Operational Guidelines, nominations should also include the following:

a) Geographical Data

- (aa) Cadastral description of the area must include:
 - i. Clearly defined core and buffer zone
 - ii. GIS diagram
 - iii. Verbal description of the GIS diagram provided
 - iv. Title deeds number/s and
 - v. Total area in hectares
- (bb) Highest point (extent, to cover for fly overs)

b) Land Ownership and Tenure

Statement of land ownership and tenure (confirmation letter from Department of Rural Development and Land Reform)

c) Land use

Statement of land uses (land use rights, mineral right etc)

d) State of Conservation of the property

(i) Biodiversity Management

- (ii) Cultural property management includes IndigenousKnowledge Systems and traditional and local practices
- (iii) Current and planned conservation management interventions

e) Financing

- (i) Proof of long term financial commitment from government structures and/or other funders to maintain and conserve the proposed site in a sustainable manner for future use **Consultation**
- (ii) Letter of consent from the relevant department in the case of state owned land or the owner/s for the inclusion of the property/properties for World Heritage site nomination;
- (iii) Proof of stakeholder consultation (minutes/ reports and signed attendance registers)
- (iv) Arrangementand plan for continuous involvement of stakeholders

f) Management Arrangement

Existing management arrangements (Joint Steering Committee in case of serial nominations)

g) Possible Socio- economic implications

Socio-economic and tourism spin-offs to the local community

h) Linkages with other programmes of Government, international convention

- (i) Contribution to the system of protected areas in South Africa;
- (ii) Does the area contribute to national priority areas;
- (iii) Linkages to other conventions (CBD, Man and Biosphere, RAMSAR) and other national objectives (Climate Change, etc)

i) Integrated Management Plan

Applicants or proponent of a World Heritage Site must submit a draft integrated management plan as an annexure to the nomination dossier in line with content as outlined in the Operational Guidelines as well as section 24 of the WHCA.

Public Comment cidb Best Practice Fee 7 March 2014

In terms of Section 23 within Chapter Four of the Construction Industry Development Board Act, 2000 (Act no. 38 of 2000) (the Act):

- 1) The Board must establish a best practice project assessment scheme, based on the best practices identified by the Board
- 2) After a date determined by the Minister in the Gazette all construction contracts above a prescribed tender value are subject to an assessment, in the prescribed manner, of compliance with best practice standards and guidelines published by the Board in the Gazette, and different dates may be determined for different practices.
- 3) Every client who engages in the best practice project assessment scheme must pay to the Board a prescribed percentage of the contract sum as determined at the time of the awarding of the contract.

A discussion document pertaining to the magnitude of the "prescribed percentage of the contract sum" (the cidb Best Practice Fee) is attached.

Discussion Document: cidb Best Practice Fee

1. Objective

Section 23 within Chapter Four of the cidb Act states that:

- The Board must establish a best practice project assessment scheme, based on the best practices identified by the Board
- 2) After a date determined by the Minister in the Gazette all construction contracts above a prescribed tender value are subject to an assessment, in the prescribed manner, of compliance with best practice standards and guidelines published by the Board in the Gazette, and different dates may be determined for different practices.
- 3) Every client who engages in the best practice project assessment scheme must pay to the Board a prescribed percentage of the contract sum as determined at the time of the awarding of the contract.

The "percentage of the contract sum as determined at the time of the awarding of the contract" is referred to here as the cidb Best Practice Fee.

This discussion document provides recommendations for the magnitude of the cidb *Best Practice Fee* to be prescribed. As background to this recommendation, the discussion document outlines:

- a) the benefits that will be derived through the cidb Best Practice Project Assessment Scheme; and
- b) the cidb strategy for providing value-added services that will be derived through the cidb *Best Practice Fee.*

It is anticipated that the cidb *Best Practice Fee* could be introduced in 2014.

2. Recommendation: cidb Best Practice Fee

As context, income projections based on a cidb *Best Practice Fee* of 0,05%, 0,1% and 0,2% of project value of Grade 7 to 9 projects, of projects enrolled in the cidb *Best Practice Project Assessment Scheme* is given below (in Rand Millions).

It is recommended that:

- a Best Practice Fee of 0,2% of the contract sum should be applied to projects of tender Grades 7
 to 9:
- a cidb Best Practice Fee of 0% should be applied to projects of tender Grades 2 to 6;
- a phased introduction of cidb best practice Standards is adopted, rolling out implementation from national government and SoCs in year 1 and 2, provincial government in year 3, metro's and high-capacity municipalities in year 4, and medium- and low-capacity municipalities in year 5;

- the Best Practice Fee will initially only apply to public sector projects, but will be broadened to include private sector projects;
- payment of the Best Practice Fee by clients to the cidb is due within 30 days of registration of the award of the contract with the cidb; and
- the cidb cannot accommodate any alternative income recovery models such as direct transfers from National Treasury.

Failure by employers to comply with these cidb requirements for enterprise development may:

- in the case of a public sector client, result in referral to the Auditor-General; or
- when implemented in the case of a private sector client, result in fines or penalties being imposed as set out in the cidb Regulations.

3. cidb Best Practice Standards; Value-Added Benefits

The cidb is currently developing a range of cidb best practice Standards that will be published by notice in the Gazette. Subject to publishing of the amendments to the Construction Industry Development (CID) Regulations, including prescribing the cidb Best Practice Fee, and subject to the date and tender values published in the Gazette, construction contracts will be required to comply with these best practice Standards.

The cidb best practice Standards being developed currently focus on the following key areas:

- a) in relation to the construction process, requirements for:
 - enterprise development;
 - skills development, workplace training of interns and up-skilling of company employees;
 - · performance reporting in relation to participants in the construction process (including contractors, the client's representative and clients);
 - project specific health and safety management plans;
 - project specific environmental management plans;
 - assessment of construction quality; and
 - compliance with legislative requirements by sub-contractors on public sector contracts;
- in relation to the design process, requirements for: b)
 - performance reporting of participants in the design process; and
 - · certification of green infrastructure;
- in relation to the *construction procurement* process, requirements for: c)
 - procurement strategies to evaluate delivery, development and empowerment objectives;
 - · project reviews at selected stages during infrastructure delivery (through a Gateway Review Process).

Further details of the cidb best practice Standards that will be implemented through the cidb Best Practice Project Assessment Scheme and which have been finalized or are in the process of being finalized are summarized below.

3.1 **Best Practice Standards; Construction Process**

i) cidb Standard for Indirect Targeting for Enterprise Development through Construction Works Contracts: The cidb Standard was published in the government gazette in February 2013, and provides for a minimum contract participation goal of 5% of the total project value on selected

contracts to be undertaken by joint-venture partners or to sub-contract to developing contractors that are also to be beneficiaries of enterprise development support from the main contractor.

- ii) cidb Standard for Developing Skills through Infrastructure Contracts: The cidb Standard was published in the government gazette in August 2013, and is a collaborative effort amongst the cidb, DPW, DHET and DED. For engineering and construction works, design and build, supply and services contracts, the Standard provides for a minimum contract participation goal of 0,5% of the tender value of General Building (GB) contracts and 0,25% of the tender value of Civil Engineering contracts (CE) to be allocated to workplace training on public sector contracts in tender Grades 7 to 9. For professional services contracts, the number of skills development hours shall be not less than the professional fees in millions of Rand multiplied by 150.
- iii) cidb Standard for Contractor Performance Reports for use on Construction Works Contracts: The cidb Standard was published in the government gazette in August 2013. The Standard provides for a uniform and consistent method of assessment of the performance of a contractor with respect to the following project parameters:
 - time management;
 - · cost management;
 - · quality management;
 - · health and safety management;
 - management of site conditions; and
 - · management of subcontractors (including payment).

The contractor performance reports will also include a record of any breaches of contract (including those resulting in the termination and/or cancelation of a contract) as well as non-compliance with mandatory cidb Best Practices, including the cidb *Code of Conduct*.

In addition, it is envisaged that cidb Standards will also shortly be published for Grade 1 contractors and for sub-contractors. The proposed cidb Standard for Contractor Performance Reports for use on Construction Works Contracts (sub-contractors) will provide for sub-contractors to carry their track record through for recognition when applying for a cidb Grading.

- iv) cidb Standard for H&S Management Plans: The draft cidb Standard is aligned with the requirements of the Construction Regulations, and will provide for a best practice standard for the H&S specification and the H&S plan to be used on construction works contracts, and for standard procedures for the approval and sign-off of the H&S specification and the H&S plan by the client. It is intended that the cidb Standard will be mandatory on public sector contracts.
- v) cidb Best Practice: Minimum Requirements for Engaging Subcontractors on Construction Works Contracts: Notwithstanding minimum legal requirements that impact on the construction industry, prime contractors do appoint sub-contractors that do not comply with minimum statutory requirements. This draft cidb Best Practice provides for employers to specify and verify that prime contractors appoint sub-contractors that comply with the following:
 - a written contract exists between the prime contractor and sub-contractor; and
 - sub-contractor who are in possession of a valid tax clearance certificate (TCC) and comply with the relevant requirements of Skills Development Levy (SDL), the Unemployment

Insurance Fund Act (UIF), and the Compensations for Occupational Injuries and Disease Act (COID).

Best Practice Standards; Delivery Process

- i) cidb Standard for Performance Reports for Professional Service Providers: The cidb has initiated the development of a cidb Standard for Performance Reports for Professional Service Providers, which is aligned to the possible development of a cidb Register of Professional Service Providers. It is intended that this cidb Standard will be published in the government gazette in March 2015. The Standard will provide for a uniform and consistent method of assessment of the performance of professional service providers.
- ii) cidb Best Practice: Green Building Certification: The cidb Best Practice was published in the government gazette in April 2011, and identified The Green Star SA rating tool "Office Version 1" of the Green Building Council of South Africa as a best practice to be followed in the design of office buildings. It is likely that the cidb will update this Standard to include reference to the "Public and Educational Building" rating tool. Note that subject to the possible development of DPW's green building rating tool, DPW has endorsed that the cidb Best Practice: Green Building Certification will be used as an interim measure.

3.3 **Best Practice Standards: Procurement Process**

- i) cidb Best Practice: Evaluating Delivery, Development and Empowerment Objectives: The cidb is developing best practice requirements which will provide for employers to assess procurement strategies to evaluate delivery, development and empowerment objectives using a standard methodology.
- ii) cidb Standard for Gateway Reviews (Grade 7 to 9): The draft National Treasury / cidb Standard for an Infrastructure Delivery Management System provides for procurement reviews at at selected gates upon which a decision to proceed or not to the next process is based. It is also envisaged that the National Treasury PFMA Regulations could also provide for National Treasury, in consultation with the cidb, to prescribe requirements for Gateway Reviews.

The cidb Standard for Gateway Reviews provides for external peer reviews at specific gates on selected Grade 7 to 9 public sector contracts, and for submission of this information to National Treasury and to the cidb. The cidb Standard is planned to be submitted to the Board for approval by March 2014.

Key Benefits to the Industry

4. cidb Value-Added Services; Ploughing Back into Industry Development

It is implicit that the income derived from the cidb *Best Practice Fee* (Section 2) should be used to provide value-added services in the construction industry, in line with the cidb's mandate.

A high level strategy for a portfolio of value-added services derived through the application of the cidb *Best Practice Fee* is given below for a best Practice fee of 0,2%. Note that the high level strategy is currently indicative only, and a detailed strategy is currently being developed by the cidb – which is dependent on the magnitude of the cidb *Best Practice Fee* adopted.

Note that monitoring of compliance with cidb procurement prescripts and with the cidb best practice Standards is of fundamental importance in its own right, and also underpins the cidb's ability to generate the income stream from the *Best Practice Fee*. The cidb compliance monitoring strategy provides for dedicated resources within the cidb provincial offices to monitor compliance with the registration of projects on the cidb *Register of Projects*.
