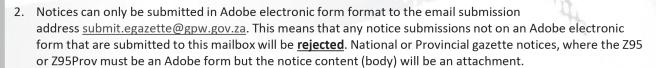
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Government Printing Works has implemented rules for completing and submitting the electronic Adobe Forms when you, the customer, submits your notice request.

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GPW Business Rules

1. No hand written notices will be accepted for processing, this includes Adobe forms which have been completed by hand.



- 3. Notices brought into GPW by "walk-in" customers on electronic media can only be submitted in Adobe electronic form format. This means that any notice submissions not on an Adobe electronic form that are submitted by the customer on electronic media will be <u>rejected</u>. National or Provincial gazette notices, where the Z95 or Z95Prov must be an Adobe form but the notice content (body) will be an attachment.
- 4. All customers who walk in to GPW that wish to submit a notice that is not on an electronic Adobe form will be routed to the Contact Centre where the customer will be taken through the completion of the form by a GPW representative. Where a customer walks into GPW with a stack of hard copy notices delivered by a messenger on behalf of a newspaper the messenger must be referred back to the sender as the submission does not adhere to the submission rules.
- 5. All notice submissions that do not comply with point 2 will be charged full price for the notice submission.
- 6. The current cut-off of all Gazette's remains unchanged for all channels. (Refer to the GPW website for submission deadlines www.gpwonline.co.za)
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- 8. All re-submissions by customers will be subject to the above cut-off times.
- 9. All submissions and re-submissions that miss the cut-off will be rejected to the customer to be submitted with a new publication date.
- 10. Information on forms will be taken as the primary source of the notice to be published. Any instructions that are on the email body or covering letter that contradicts the notice form content will be ignored.

You are therefore advised that effective from **Monday**, **18 May 2015** should you not comply with our new rules of engagement, all notice requests will be rejected by our new system.

CALL FOR WRITTEN SUBMISSIONS FROM STAKEHOLDER BODIES AND MEMBERS OF THE PUBLIC ON THE DRAFT AMENDMENT REGULATIONS PERTAINING TO THE NATIONAL CURRICULUM STATEMENT GRADES R-12 AND THE CONDUCT, ADMINISTRATION AND MANAGEMENT OF THE NATIONAL SENIOR CERTIFICATE EXAMINATION,

- I, Angelina Matsie Motshekga, Minister of Basic Education, hereby, in terms of section 61(c) and (d) of the South African Schools Act, 1996 (Act. No. 84 of 1996) and after consultation with the Council of Education Ministers give my intention to amend the following regulations to accommodate the Incremental Implementation of African Languages (IIAL):
 - (a) Regulations Pertaining to the National Curriculum Statement Grades R-12, promulgated as Government Notice 1114 in Government Gazette No. 36041 of 28 December 2012 (Schedule 1); and
 - (b) Regulations Pertaining to the Conduct, Administration and Management of the National Senior Certificate examination, promulgated as Government Regulation Notice No. R872 in Government Gazette No. 31337 of 29 August 2008 (Schedule 2).
 - In view of this, I invite stakeholder bodies and members of the public to comment on the relevant regulation change as set out in **Schedule 1** and 2.

DEFINITIONS

 In these regulations "the Regulations" means the regulations published as Government Notice 1114 in Government Gazette No. 36041 of 28 December 2012 as amended as-

Government Notice 564 in Government Gazette, No. 37840 dated 18 July 2014;

Government Notices 625 and 626 in Government Gazette, No. 37910 dated 13 August 2014;

Government Notice 235 in Government Gazette, No. 38589 dated 20 March 2015:

Amendment of Regulation 5 of the Regulations

- 2. Regulation 5 is hereby amended by
 - the substitution of sub-regulation 1(c) of the following sub-regulation"A learner who has enrolled for Grades 1-3 at a public or an independent school offering the National Curriculum Statement Grades R-12 must offer the following [four (4)] five (5) subjects stipulated in paragraph 6(2) of the policy document, National policy pertaining to the programme and promotion requirements of the National Curriculum Statement Grades R 12"
 - (b) the insertion after sub-regulation (1)(c)(ii)) of the following sub-regulation-"(iiA)One official language at Second Additional Language level provided it is not the same official language offered at sub-regulation_ii." "(iiB) one of the three official languages is a previously marginalised indigenous African language."
 - (c) the substitution of sub-regulation 1(d) of the following sub-regulation-
 - "The **[four (4)]** five (5) subjects listed in *sub-regulation (c)* must be offered in accordance with the subject requirements as stipulated in *Sections 2* and 3 of the *Curriculum and Assessment Policy Statements* for the said subjects and listed in **Annexure A**."
 - (d) the substitution of sub-regulation 1(f) of the following sub-regulation-

"A **[third official or]** non-official language at Second Additional Language level or a higher level may be introduced to learners in the Foundation Phase, provided the Foundation Phase programme requirements as stipulated in *sub-regulations a, b, c, d* and *e* are met and the offering of a **[third official or]** non-official language at Second Additional Language level or a higher level does not replace any one of the required **[two]** three official languages at Home and First Additional Language level, as contemplated in *sub-regulation (c)*, provided further that:"

- (e) the substitution of sub-regulation 1(f)(i) of the following sub-regulation-
 - "the offering of a **[third official or]** non-official language at Second Additional Language level or a higher level does not affect the official number of hours teaching time allocated for compulsory subjects in the Foundation Phase as contemplated in paragraph 10 of the policy document, National policy pertaining to the programme and promotion requirements of the National Curriculum Statement Grades R 12;"
- (f) the insertion at the end of sub-regulation 1(f)(ii) of the following sub-"except in the case of the third compulsory language;"
- (g) the substitution of sub-regulation 1(iii) of the following sub-regulation"the Curriculum and Assessment Policy Statement of the selected [official or] non-official language must be developed in terms of the generic English Language Curriculum and Assessment Policy Statement at the level selected; and"
- the substitution of sub-regulation 2(a) of the following sub-regulation"A learner who has enrolled for Grades 4-6 at a public or an independent school offering the *National Curriculum Statement Grades*R-12 must offer the following [six (6)] seven (7) subjects stipulated in paragraphs 11 and 12 of the policy document, *National policy pertaining*to the programme and promotion requirements of the National Curriculum Statement Grades R 12."
- the substitution of sub-regulation 2(a)(i) of the following sub-regulation"[Two (2)] three (3) official languages, provided that one of the [two] three official languages is offered on the Home Language level, and the other official language on at least First Additional Language level, and provided further that one of the two languages offered is the language of learning and teaching or the language of literacy in the case of Deaf Learners;"
- the insertion after sub-regulation (2)(a)(i) of the following sub-regulation-"(i1) one of the three official languages should be a previously marginalised African language selected from Table 6:"
- the substitution of sub-regulation 2(b)(i) of the following sub-regulation"One official or approved non-official language may be offered as an optional subject on at least Second Additional Language level, provided that in the case of an official language, the language offered is not a language offered in terms of *sub-regulation* (i) above. The optional language will be regarded as an additional subject. Optional languages

- may only be offered if the school can make an arrangement for the allocation of additional time to the allocated [27,5] 29,5 hours."
- (I) the substitution of sub-regulation 2(b)(i) of the following sub-regulation"The [six (6)] seven (7) subjects listed in sub-regulation (a) must be offered in accordance with the subject requirements as stipulated in Sections 2 and 3 of the Curriculum and Assessment Policy Statements for the said subjects and listed in Annexure B."
- (m) the substitution of sub-regulation 3(a) of the following sub-regulation"A learner who has enrolled for Grades 7-9 at a public or an independent school offering the *National Curriculum Statement Grades*R-12 must offer and complete the internal and external assessment requirements of the following [nine (9)] ten (10) subjects stipulated in paragraphs 18 and 19 of the policy document, *National policy pertaining*to the programme and promotion requirements of the National Curriculum Statement Grades R 12"
- (n) the insertion after sub-regulation (3)(a)(i) of the following sub-regulation-"(i1) one of the three official languages offered should, subject to paragraph 13, be a previously marginalised Indigenous African language;"
- (o) the substitution of sub-regulation (3)(a)(ix) of the following sub-regulation-"One official or approved non-official language may be offered as an optional subject on at least Second Additional Language level, provided that in the case of an official language, the language offered must not be a language offered in terms of sub-regulation (i) above. The Additional Language will be regarded as an additional subject not to be considered for promotion requirements. Optional languages may only be offered if the school can make an arrangement for the allocation of additional time to the allocated [27, 5] 29.5 hours."
- (n) the substitution of sub-regulation 3(b) of the following sub-regulation"The [nine (9)] ten 10 subjects listed in sub-regulation (a) are offered in accordance with Sections 2 and 3 of the subject requirements as stipulated in the Curriculum and Assessment Policy Statements for the said subjects and listed in Annexure C."
- (n) the substitution of sub-regulation 4B(a) of the following sub-regulation"A learner at a public or an independent school offering the National Curriculum Statement Grades R-12, who has enrolled for either an Academic (General) or Technical pathway, must offer and complete the School Based Assessment, Practical Assessment Tasks and oral, and the external assessment requirements of the following [seven (7)] eight (8) subjects grouped in two main categories, namely Groups A and B as stipulated in paragraph 27 of the policy document, National policy pertaining to the programme and promotion requirements of the National Curriculum Statement Grades R 12 (Annexure D)."
- (o) the substitution of sub-regulation 4B(b)(i) of the following sub-regulation-"[Two (2)] three (3) official languages, provided that one of the [two] three official languages is offered on the Home Language level, [and]

the other, on either Home or First Additional Language level, and the other at <u>Second Additional Language level</u>, provided further that one of the **[two]** three languages is the language of learning and teaching of the school or institution, or the language of literacy in the case of Deaf Learners."

- (p) the insertion after sub-regulation (4B)(i) of the following sub-regulation-"(i1) one of the three <u>languages offered is a previously marginalised</u> <u>Indigenous African language"</u>
- the substitution of sub-regulation 4B (e) of the following sub-regulation"The [seven (7)] eight (8) subjects listed in sub-regulation (a) must be offered in accordance with the subject requirements as stipulated in Sections 2 and 3 of the Curriculum and Assessment Policy Statements for the said subjects and listed in Annexure D. Where required, an accredited assessment body may deviate from the suggested content sequence, contemplated in Chapters 3 and 4 of the Curriculum and Assessment Policy Statements provided the minimum stipulated content is covered."

SCHEDULE 2

DEFINITIONS

1. In these regulations, "regulations" mean the regulations published as Regulations pertaining to the conduct, administration and management of the National Senior Certificate examination, published as Government Regulation Notice No. R872 in Government Regulation Gazette No. 31337 of 29 August 2008 and amended as: Government Notices No. 1327 and 1328 in Government Gazette, Vol. 522, No.31680 dated 12 December 2008; and

Amendment of Regulation 9 of the Regulations

- 1. Regulation 9 is hereby amended by-
- (a) the substitution for sub-regulation (2) of the following sub-regulation"(1) The Minister of Basic Education may approve a new subject to be offered by a
 learner as part of the **[7-subject]** 8-subject package, subject to specific conditions, as
 contemplated in Annexure B of this document and Annexure B1 of the policy document,
 National policy pertaining to the programme and promotion requirements of the National
 Curriculum Statement Grades R 12."

Short Title and Commencement

These Regulations may be cited as the Regulations Pertaining to the Conduct, Administration and Management of the National Senior Certificate examination and will come into effect on the date of publication in the Government Gazette.

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
