


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# Government Printing Works Notice submission deadlines

Government Printing Works has over the last few months implemented rules for completing and submitting the electronic Adobe Forms when you, the customer, submit your notice request.

In line with these business rules, GPW has revised the notice submission deadlines for all gazettes. Please refer to the GPW website <u>www.gpwonline.co.za</u> to familiarise yourself with the new deadlines.

## CANCELLATIONS

Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette.

#### Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.

Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

# AMENOMENTS TO NOTICES note

With effect from 01 October, GPW will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

## CUSTOMER INQUIRIES

Many of our customers request immediate feedback/confirmation of notice placement in the gazette from our Contact Centre once they have submitted their notice – While GPW deems it one of their highest priorities and responsibilities to provide customers with this requested feedback and the best service at all times, we are only able to do so once we have started processing your notice submission.

GPW has a <u>2-working day turnaround time for processing notices</u> received according to the business rules and deadline submissions.

Please keep this in mind when making inquiries about your notice submission at the Contact Centre.

# PROOF OF PAYMENTS REMINDER

GPW reminds you that all notice submissions **MUST** be submitted with an accompanying proof of payment (PoP) or purchase order (PO). If any PoP's or PO's are received without a notice submission, it will be failed and your notice will not be processed.

When submitting your notice request to <u>submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za</u>, please ensure that a purchase order (GPW Account customer) or proof of payment (non-GPW Account customer) is included with your notice submission. All documentation relating to the notice submission must be in a single email.

A reminder that documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW. (In other words, your email should have an Adobe Form plus proof of payment/purchase order – 2 separate attachments – where notice content is applicable, it should also be a 3rd separate attachment).

### REMINDER OF THE GPW BUSINESS RULES

- □ Single notice, single email with proof of payment or purchase order.
- All documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW.
- 1 notice = 1 form, i.e. each notice must be on a separate form
- Please submit your notice ONLY ONCE.
- Requests for information, quotations and inquiries must be sent to the Contact Centre ONLY.
- The notice information that you send us on the form is what we publish. Please do not put any instructions in the email body.

# DRAFT AMENDMENT REGULATIONS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A NATIONAL INSTITUTE FOR THE HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

I, Bonginkosi Emmanuel Nzimande, MP, Minister of Higher Education and Training after consultation with the Council on Higher Education, intend to amend the Regulations for the Establishment of a National Institute for the Humanities and Social Sciences, 2013, promulgated by Notice No. 952, in Government Gazette No 37118 of 5 December 2013, as a means to operationalise the legal requirements of section 69, read with sections 38A, 38B and 38C of the Higher Education Act, 1997 (Act No. 101 of 1997) Regulations of which can be downloaded from the Department's website at www.dhet.gov.za.

The Draft Amendment Regulations for the Establishment of a National Institute for the Humanities and Social Sciences, is set out in the Schedule.

#### **Amendment of Chapter 1 of the Regulations**

#### Definition

 In this Schedule "the regulations" means the Regulations for the Establishment of a National Institute for the Humanities and Social Sciences, 2013, promulgated by Notice No. 952, in Government Gazette No. 37118 of 5 December 2013, as a means to operationalise the legal requirements of section 69, read with sections 38A, 38B and 38C of the Higher Education Act, 1997 (Act No. 101 of 1997), and as amended.

#### Amendment of Regulation 1

- 2. Regulation 1 is hereby amended by
  - a) the insertion after the definition of 'African Pathway' of the following definition':

'BRICS' means the Brazil, Russia, India, China and South African grouping;

b) the insertion after the definition of 'NIHSS' of the following definition ':

'South African BRICS Think Tank'means an Institute appointed or established to generate knowledge and research and provide the South African government with sound, evidence based policy advice on BRICS related matters;

#### Amendment of Regulation 10

- 3. Regulation 10 is hereby amended by the insertion after sub-regulation (i, of the following sub-regulation:
  - (i) [and];coordinate and manage all BRICS Think Tank related activities on behalf of South Africa as the South African BRICS Think Tank; and(k)

#### **Amendment of Regulation 15**

- 4. Regulation 15 is hereby amended by the substitution for regulation 15 of the following regulation:
  - 15 These regulations are called the <u>Amendment</u> Regulations for the Establishment of a National Institute for the Humanities and Social Sciences, **[2013]** 2016 and come into operation **[on]**<u>upon</u> a date **[of publication]** the Minister appoints the interim board by Notice <u>in the</u> <u>Government Gazette</u>.
