In line with these business rules, GPW has revised the notice submission deadlines for all gazettes. Please refer to the GPW website www.gpwonline.co.za to familiarise yourself with the new deadlines.

CANCELLATIONS

Don't forget!

Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above.

Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. **Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette.**

Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.

Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must be accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

AMENDMENTS TO NOTICES

take note!

With effect from 01 October, GPW will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

CUSTOMER INQUIRIES

PROOF OF PAYMENTS



GPW reminds you that all notice submissions **MUST** be submitted with an accompanying proof of payment (PoP) or purchase order (PO). If any PoP's or PO's are received without a notice submission, it will be failed and your notice will not be processed.

When submitting your notice request to submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za, please ensure that a purchase order (GPW Account customer) or proof of payment (non-GPW Account customer) is included with your notice submission. All documentation relating to the notice submission must be in a single email.

A reminder that documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW. (In other words, your email should have an Adobe Form plus proof of payment/purchase order – 2 separate attachments – where notice content is applicable, it should also be a 3rd separate attachment).

REMINDER OF THE GPW BUSINESS RULES

- Single notice, single email – with proof of payment or purchase order.
- All documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW.
- 1 notice = 1 form, i.e. each notice must be on a separate form
- Please submit your notice **ONLY ONCE**.
- Requests for information, quotations and inquiries must be sent to the Contact Centre **ONLY**.
- The notice information that you send us on the form is what we publish. Please do not put any instructions in the email body.

Explanatory Memorandum to the Provincial Allocations set out in the Schedule

This *Gazette* is published in terms of the Division of Revenue Act, 2015 (Act No. 01 of 2015), and provides information on adjustments to existing allocations to provinces in the 2015/16 financial year.

This is necessitated by the need to stop the flow of funds in terms of Section 19 of the Division of Revenue Act, 2015, and the need to re-allocate the stopped funds to provinces, as approved in terms of Section 20 of the Division of Revenue Act, 2015.

This *Gazette* therefore updates information that was published in the Division of Revenue Act, 2015.

This notice affects the Human Settlements Development Grant and the Substance Abuse Treatment Grant:

- a) In compliance with Section 19 of the Division of Revenue Act, 2015, the national Department of Human Settlements stops the transfer of funds to Gauteng (R908.377 million) for the Human Settlements Development grant, following revised allocations by the national Department Human Settlements.
- b) In compliance with Section 20 of the Division of Revenue Act, 2015, the national Department of Human Settlements re-allocates funds to KwaZulu-Natal (R308.377 million), Eastern Cape (R400 million), Northern Cape (R100 million) and North West (R100 million) for the Human Settlements Development grant, following revised allocations by the national Department of Human Settlements.
- c) In compliance with Section 19 of the Division of Revenue Act, 2015, the national Department of Social Development stops the transfer of funds to Northern Cape (R6 million) for the Substance Abuse Treatment grant, following revised allocations by the national Department Social Development.
- d) In compliance with Section 20 of the Division of Revenue Act, 2015, the national Department of Social Development re-allocates funds to Free State (R6 million) for the Substance Abuse Treatment grant, following revised allocations by the national Department of Social Development.

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
