Notice submission deadlines

Government Printing Works has over the last few months implemented rules for completing and submitting the electronic Adobe Forms when you, the customer, submit your notice request.

In line with these business rules, GPW has revised the notice submission deadlines for all gazettes. Please refer to the GPW website www.gpwonline.co.za to familiarise yourself with the new deadlines.

CANCELLATIONS



Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette.

Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.

Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

AMENOMENTS TO NOTICES



With effect <u>from 01 October</u>, GPW will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

CUSTOMER INQUIRIES



Many of our customers request immediate feedback/confirmation of notice placement in the gazette from our Contact Centre once they have submitted their notice – While GPW deems it one of their highest priorities and responsibilities to provide customers with this requested feedback and the best service at all times, we are only able to do so once we have started processing your notice submission.

GPW has a **2-working day turnaround time for processing notices** received according to the business rules and deadline submissions.

PROOF OF PAYMENTS REMINDER

GPW reminds you that all notice submissions **MUST** be submitted with an accompanying proof of payment (PoP) or purchase order (PO). If any PoP's or PO's are received without a notice submission, it will be failed and your notice will not be processed.

When submitting your notice request to submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za, please ensure that a purchase order (GPW Account customer) or proof of payment (non-GPW Account customer) is included with your notice submission. All documentation relating to the notice submission must be in a single email.

A reminder that documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW. (In other words, your email should have an Adobe Form plus proof of payment/purchase order – 2 separate attachments – where notice content is applicable, it should also be a 3rd separate attachment).

- ☐ All documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW.
- 1 notice = 1 form, i.e. each notice must be on a separate form

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B-BBEE FACILITATORS STATUS

When an entity has been granted a facilitators status, then a designated organ of state or public entity own shares in a private or listed company the shares will be treated as follows:

- 100% by black people
- 40% by black women
- 20% by Black designated groups.

AEMFC APPLICATION FOR B-BBEE FACILITATOR STATUS

AEMFC is a public entity, a wholly owned subsidiary of the Central Energy Fund (CEF) that report to the Minister of Energy. It main significant customer is Eskom, which they supply with coal. Their mandate is as follows:

- To hold all exploration and mineral rights in respect of all energy-related and other minerals, on behalf of state, and to engage in the mining thereof;
- To be a catalyst in advancing the department of Mineral resources' beneficiation strategy and to support the Department of Energy's Integrated Resources Plan;
- To collaborate with BEE black owned / controlled companies and other State Owned Entities in the execution of its mandate;
- To be a standalone entity that will form the nucleus of the Country's State Owned Mining Company.

The benefit of AEMFC facilitator status will be as follows:

- AEMFC would like to partner with Black owned entities in the mining entities in furtherance of its mandate. In addition it will enable it to increasingly partner to form joint ventures with other local and international companies without diluting their B-BBEE shareholding status.
- The status will enable AEMFC to access some of the funds which are held by various organisations for development purpose. It will thus increase its level of business that it currently conducts.
- It will allow it to supply other black controlled companies without comprising the B-BBEE credentials of those companies.
- Overall the facilitator status will ensure that the company grows and strongly discharge its mandate.

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
