

Government Printing Works Notice submission deadlines

Government Printing Works has over the last few months implemented rules for completing and submitting the electronic Adobe Forms when you, the customer, submit your notice request.

In line with these business rules, GPW has revised the notice submission deadlines for all gazettes. Please refer to the GPW website <u>www.gpwonline.co.za</u> to familiarise yourself with the new deadlines.

CANCELLATIONS

Cancellation of notice submissions are accepted by GPW according to the deadlines stated in the table above. Non-compliance to these deadlines will result in your request being failed. Please pay special attention to the different deadlines for each gazette.

Please note that any notices cancelled after the cancellation deadline will be published and charged at full cost.

Requests for cancellation must be sent by the original sender of the notice and must accompanied by the relevant notice reference number (N-) in the email body.

AMENOMENTS TO NOTICES note

With effect <u>from 01 October</u>, GPW will not longer accept amendments to notices. The cancellation process will need to be followed and a new notice submitted thereafter for the next available publication date.

CUSTOMER INQUIRIES 👹

Many of our customers request immediate feedback/confirmation of notice placement in the gazette from our Contact Centre once they have submitted their notice – While GPW deems it one of their highest priorities and responsibilities to provide customers with this requested feedback and the best service at all times, we are only able to do so once we have started processing your notice submission.

GPW has a <u>2-working day turnaround time for processing notices</u> received according to the business rules and deadline submissions.

PROOF OF PAYMENTS REMINDER

GPW reminds you that all notice submissions **MUST** be submitted with an accompanying proof of payment (PoP) or purchase order (PO). If any PoP's or PO's are received without a notice submission, it will be failed and your notice will not be processed.

When submitting your notice request to <u>submit.egazette@gpw.gov.za</u>, please ensure that a purchase order (GPW Account customer) or proof of payment (non-GPW Account customer) is included with your notice submission. All documentation relating to the notice submission must be in a single email.

A reminder that documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW. (In other words, your email should have an Adobe Form plus proof of payment/purchase order – 2 separate attachments – where notice content is applicable, it should also be a 3rd separate attachment).

REMINDER OF THE GPW BUSINESS RULES

- □ Single notice, single email with proof of payment or purchase order.
- All documents must be attached separately in your email to GPW.
- 1 notice = 1 form, i.e. each notice must be on a separate form
- Please submit your notice ONLY ONCE.
- Requests for information, quotations and inquiries must be sent to the Contact Centre ONLY.
- The notice information that you send us on the form is what we publish. Please do not put any instructions in the email body.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS OF SUITABLE CANDIDATES TO SERVE AS MEMBERS ON THE BOARD OF THE OFFICE OF HEALTH STANDARDS COMPLIANCE

The Office of Health Standards Compliance, herein referred to as the OHSC, was established in terms of the National Health Amendment Act, 2013 (Act No. 12 of 2013), herein referred to as the Act, to regulate compliance with norms and standards by health establishments. The objects of the OHSC are to protect and promote the health and safety of users of health services by monitoring and enforcing compliance by health establishments with norms and standards prescribed by the Minister in relation to the national health system, and ensuring consideration, investigation and disposal of complaints relating to non-compliance with prescribed norms and standards in a procedurally fair, economical and expeditious manner.

In terms of Section 79B(1) of the Act, the Minister may appoint no less than seven (7) and no more than twelve (12) Board members, in accordance with the categories stated under paragraphs (a)-(g) of that section. The five (5) members appointable under paragraph (a) will be nominated by the relevant schools of health at institutions of higher learning.

The Honourable Minister of Health, Dr Aaron Motsoaledi hereby invites nominations of suitable candidates to serve as Board Members of the Office of Health Standards Compliance in the categories listed under Section 79B(1)(b) to (h), for a term of office of three (3) years effective from **1 January 2017**, as follows:

- (b) One (1) nominee to be appointed on account of his/her knowledge of the law;
- (c) One (1) nominee to be appointed on account of his/her knowledge of economics and financial matters or accounting;
- (d) One (1) nominee to be appointed on account of his/her knowledge of private healthcare sector;
- (e) One (1) nominee to be appointed on account of his/her knowledge of public healthcare and public administration;
- (f) One (1) nominee to be appointed on account of his/her knowledge of quality assurance;
- (g) One (1) nominee to be appointed as a representative from organised labour; and
- (h) One (1) nominee to be appointed as a representative from civil society or the community.

Nominated candidates should have an appropriate qualification, expert knowledge and at least ten (10) years experience in the healthcare sector. Visionaries, who are able to formulate and implement strategy, define policies and priorities consistent with the developmental health agenda of the government, who are committed to the principles of good corporate governance, and have knowledge of risk management, financial management, project management and the business of the OHSC, are encouraged to apply.

Nomination particulars: Nominations must be made on a prescribed nomination form obtainable from the Department of Health website: <u>www.doh.gov.za</u> and the OHSC website: <u>www.ohsc.org.za</u>

A comprehensive Curriculum Vitae (CV) of the nominee should be attached, including certified copies of academic qualifications and supporting information. Kindly note that the nomination form lists the conditions under which a person may be **disqualified** from membership of the Board and the **remuneration** of the Board of the OHSC.

HEALTH PROFESSIONS ACT, 1974 (ACT NO. 56 OF 1974)

REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE REGISTRATION BY EMERGENCY CARE PRACTITIONERS OF ADDITIONAL QUALIFICATIONS: AMENDMENT

The Minister of Health has, under section 61(1) (k) read with section 35 (2) of the Health Professions Act, 1974 (Act No. 56 of 1974) and after consultation with the Health Professions Council of South Africa, made the Regulations in the Schedule.

SCHEDULE

Definitions

- In these regulations, "Act" means the Health Professions Act, 1974 (Act No. 56 of 1974) and any word or expression to which a meaning has been assigned in the Act has the meaning so assigned.
- The following qualifications held by Emergency Care Practitioners are registrable as additional qualifications under section 35 of the Act:
