

## MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1941

DECLARATION OR DESIGNATION OF THE 2016 SUN  
INTERNATIONAL CEO SLEEPOUT AS A PROTECTED EVENT

I, Dr. Rob Davies, Minister of Trade and Industry hereby, in terms of section 15A of the Merchandise Act, 1941 (Act 17 of 1941 hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), designate the 2016 Sun International CEO SleepOut (hereinafter referred to as "CEO SleepOut") as a "protected event".

1. The protected event status is conferred on the CEO SleepOut on the understanding that the SleepOut is in the public interest and that the Organisers of the event (hereinafter referred to as "Organisers") have created opportunities for South African businesses, in particular those from the previously disadvantaged communities.
2. The "protected event" designation is on the understanding that:
  - (a) The procurement policy of the Organisers shall comply with the public sector procurement principles such as procedural and substantive fairness, equity, transparency and competitiveness.
  - (b) The procurement policy of the Organisers shall apply constitutional procurement principles, the Preferential Procurement Policy Framework Act, 2000 (Act No. 5 of 2000), the Department of Trade and Industry codes of good practice for Broad Based Black Economic Empowerment (BBBEE) when evaluating suppliers and administrative law principles of fair procedure.
  - (c) The Organisers must submit an impact assessment of the CEO SleepOut on communities in South Africa to the Minister of Trade and Industry at least six months and not more than 12 months after the termination of the "protected event" designation.
  - (d) The date of termination of the "protected event" designation is 28 August



## MERCHANDISE MARKS ACT, 1941

FINAL PROHIBITION ON THE USE OF CERTAIN WORDS AND EMBLEMS OF THE  
2016 SUN INTERNATIONAL CEO SLEEPOUT

I, Dr. Rob Davies, Minister of Trade and Industry hereby advertise a final notice in terms of section 15(1)(b) of the Merchandise Act, 1941 (Act 17 of 1941) that prohibits the use of the words, device, logo, pictures and drawings as depicted in Annexure "A" or similar drawings which might cause confusion with any trade, business, profession or occupation or event, or in connection with any trade mark, mark or trade description applied to goods, save where the use thereof is by the authority of the 2016 Sun International CEO SleepOut.

The prohibition of these logo/marks will come to an end with the termination of the "protected event" designation on 28 August 2016.

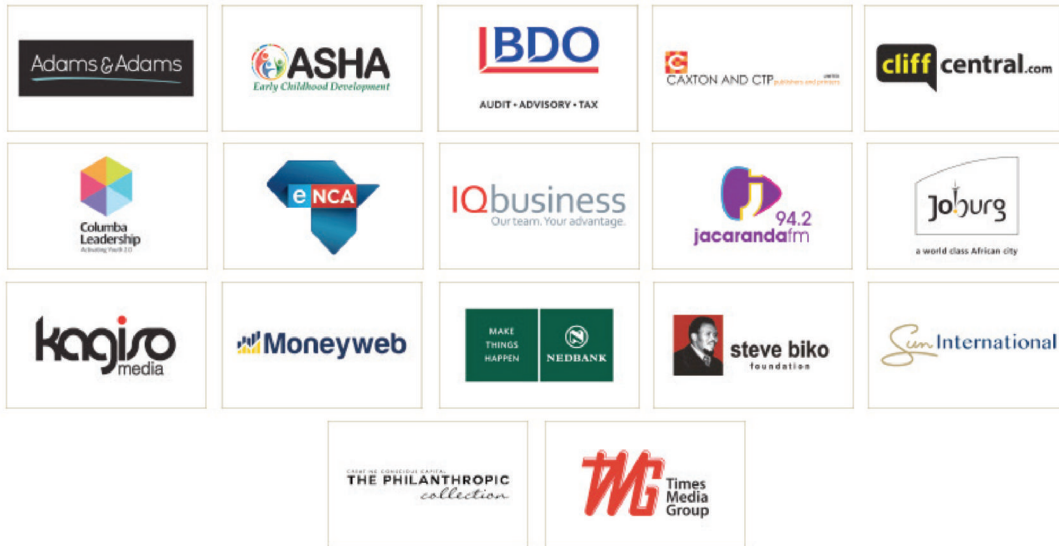
